


Our Women's Bible Study will meet on February 10th and February 24th at 6:30 pm. All women are invited to attend. Each lesson stands alone, so come if and when you can.



President Jeff Luetje called the meeting to order.

Pastor Dose opened with a prayer with readings from John 4.

The minutes from the Quarterly Voter's Meeting were read and reviewed. A motion was made by Vernon Ehlers, seconded by Kevin Skinner to accept the minutes. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dose reviewed his report in the Annual Report.

Elder's Report: Kevin Skinner reviewed the Elder's report in the Annual Report.

The Elders discussed the proposed new church plant as presented by a member of our congregation at the December 2013 council meeting. After much discussion, it was moved by Merle Witt, seconded by Gene Thiedeman, to approve the following resolution: "A new church plant was proposed at the December 2013 council meeting by a member of our congregation. The Elders have discussed this with District President Sieveking and with the other Pastors in the Carroll Circuit, and at his time, the Carroll Circuit pastors are unanimously opposed to the new church plant as it has been proposed. Since the Word of God is being purely preached and taught according to the Lutheran Confessions, and the Sacraments of Christ are being administered according to His institution, the Elders and the Congregation are in full support of Pastor Dose and of our current worship style at Zion Lutheran Church in Arcadia." Motion carried. Resolution was adopted.

Also, church secretary Deb Owen could not get on the hospital insurance and will need to be on the Church insurance. A discussion was held involving the Endowment Fund in the Church Constitution allowing possibility Endowment Fund aiding in the cost of this insurance for a specified period of time.

Treasurer's Report: Cindy Brockman gave the treasurer's report from the Annual Report. Balance on hand in the General fund as of December 31, 2013, was \$8,922.60.

Balance of the Memorial Fund was \$9,394.73, Building Fund balance was \$4,770.95 and the Repair Fund balance was 36,850.22. The General fund balance as of January 15, 2014, is \$10,538.29. A motion was made by Al Hunter, seconded by Kevin Skinner, to accept the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Board of Education: Dawn Luetje announced that Chad Wittrock will be taking over the LYF as their leader this year. Dawn was recognized for her many years as adult leader of the LYF.

Board of Evangelism: Marilyn Mumm reported that the "Journey to the Cross" went very well. She will look into starting a new greeter's list again.

Board of Stewardship: The proposed budget was presented. Some changes were made... Total budget for 2014 will by \$186,828.04

Trustee Report: No Report given.

Secretary-Paulette Von Glan

Financial Secretary: No Report given, just reminder to have members pick up their 2014 envelopes.

Endowment Fund: Rahn Eischeid presented the end of the year report. He then went over the proposed items for 2014. Discussion was held on the proposed items. Motion by Sandy Hunter, seconded by Al Hunter to approve the proposed projects with corrections. Total amount available in the Endowment Fund for 2014 is \$52,012.47. Motion carried.

Old Business: A discussion was held concerning marriages in our church. It was moved by Sandy Hunter, seconded by Al Hunter to change the marriage policy to reflect that only heterosexual marriages in our church be held. This will be in line with most churches in our Synod. This will require a change to our Church Constitution and future voter's meetings will be planned for the change of our Church Constitution concerning heterosexual marriages. Motion carried.

Also discussed was need to get the books audited. We will get a committee to do this.

New Business: Deb Owen will look into the cost of backing up our computers on the cloud with Computer Concepts in Carroll

Ladies Aid and Evening Circle met and discussed working funeral dinners. If a funeral is at our Church and will serve less than 100, the Ladies Aid will serve the lunch consisting of drinks and supply the desserts. All other food will need to be catered. All funerals over 100 will need to be held at another location for the meal.

Chad Wittrock will work on a new website for our church. The set up fee will be \$1,591 and this amount will be for 3 years, with minimal fee beyond 3 years. Chad reported that there are many features that could be added to the new website including sermon texts, podcasts of sermons with audio, bulletins, newsletters, pictures, and special events. More than one person will be able to have special access to the website to add items enabling a team approach to managing the site. Chad said he will provide content updates and maintenance as a donation to our Church.

Motion was taken to adjourn, seconded, and meeting was adjourned	Pastor closed with a blessing.






Pasadena Mission Trip Reflections 2014

Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and about which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. ¹³ I charge you in the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, ¹⁴ to keep the commandment unstained and free from reproach until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁵ which he will display at the proper time—he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords, ¹⁶ who alone has immortality, who dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see. To him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen.

In the last few days I had the opportunity to represent lowa District West at the Youth Ministry 2014 Symposium held in St. Louis, dealing with the theme, "Faith, Values, and Millennials." This symposium focused on research done by Christian Smith, author of the books *Soul Searching; The Religious and Spiritual Lives of American Teenagers, Souls in Transition; The Religious & Spiritual Lives of Emerging Adults*. The book, *Lost in Transition: The Dark Side of Emerging Adulthood*, was presented for the symposium by researchers and coauthors Hilary Davidson and Dr. Patricia Herzog. In all of these books there is research done on what is happening to the millennial generation as they age from teenagers to emerging adults. They do the research on the same youth from their teen years to the emerging adulthood years.

There are five main points the book *Lost in Transition* deals with in regards to the worldview of the emerging adults. Those five worldviews are *Morality Adrift, Captive to Consumerism, Intoxication's "Fake Feeling of Happiness," The Shadow Side of Sexual Liberation, and Civic and Political Disengagement.* These were the main topics for the Plenary Sessions by Hillary and Trish. Each time there was a Lutheran response given by Tom Couser a retired DCE from Texas who wrote the book, *Passing the Torch; Sharing Faith and Values with the Millenial Generation*.

There are two main ways to respond to the "dark side" of the emerging adult culture. One is the "Chicken Little" effect where we look around and say like Chicken Little did many times, "The sky is falling," meaning this is not good and there is nothing we can do and the world is going to end. On the other hand, we can look at the situation with the mindset "There is nothing new under the sun" meaning there is complacency and things will right themselves eventually.

As Lutherans we live with paradoxes! We can view them both and live in them both! We can be about engaging the emerging adult culture with the sound doctrine and catechesis we are known for while being "relevant" with the cross of Jesus Christ! We can catechize the teachings of God's love and grace which are never changing in Jesus Christ. He continues to meet all people, youth and adults, in the Word and Sacraments in the Divine Service. We have a foundation in Youth Ministry and all ministries that is built, "On Christ, the solid rock I stand; All other ground is sinking sand" (LSB 575). We can fight the good fight of faith in the confession we made of Jesus Christ at our Confirmations "in the presence of many witnesses."

Is it a changing and emerging world? Absolutely! Is it dark and scary what the church is going to be up against in the culture? Absolutely! Do we have to wring our hands and think there is nothing we have to offer the world or our youth from IDW? Absolutely not! Do we bury our heads in the sand and close the doors to the outside world? Absolutely not! We confess Jesus Christ who is the "same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13).
