This sacrament is Christ's body and blood given and shed for us for the forgiveness of sins. God comes to us over and over again to help us know that we are not alone in this world. Even though it seems this world is decaying and people are doing crazy things, God gives us these promises that He is always with us and will never leave us or forsake us. It seems like receiving the news of this world can lead us to despair. But listen to this quote from Lutheran Pastor and Doctor of Theology, Hermann Sasse,

Whether the church is present or not does not depend on the good or evil will of people, but only on his will. If he in limitless mercy wills that his Gospel be preached also in the future among our people, and those generations of our people yet unborn should hear the saving message of the forgiveness of sins for the sake of Christ, then it will most certainly happen. No one knows how it happens. It may be that it will happen without the methods of modern "publicity" and without the technical means of the modern transmission of information. But there can be no doubt that the mandate shall be carried out: "What is whispered in your ear, proclaim from the rooftops." Matthew 10:27. "Go forth and preach the Gospel to all creatures!" Mark 16:15. (The Lonely Way; Selected Essays and Letters, Volume 1 (1927-1939) pg. 463)

The August Church Council Meeting will be held on Wednesday, August 20 at 7:30 pm. There will be an Elders' meeting at 6:30 pm that same evening



On August 24th we will present the 3rd-5th graders with their Bibles to be used for Sunday School and Midweek Classes.




There will be a meeting of the Midweek Students and their parents on Wednesday, August 13 at 7 pm

Dear youth ministry partner,

"I don't know what to do," Jill sobbed out to her best friend when they saw one another. "My parents keep saying that it will be alright, but that's easy to say. Those are just words. Things don't feel like they will be alright."

Words are all around us, pounding in our ears relentlessly. With so many words pouring upon us each day, it is easy to think of them as "just words." We have real problems, real pain, real sin. We need more than just words to deal with our hurt and pain, don't we? The truth is we all need to be reminded that God's Word is different from all the other words we hear every day. Absolution is not just words in the background, but is God's gift of real power, real forgiveness, real life.

The theme of the 2014 Iowa District West Junior Youth Gathering is "Not Just Words." The Apostle Peter tells us, "Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out" (Acts 3:19). By His death and resurrection, through His Word and Sacraments, Jesus has given us, not just words, but true power and forgiveness, true grace and mercy, new life.


The 2014 Gathering continues the tradition of focusing on one of the chief parts of Luther's Small Catechism. This year's focus will be Confession/Absolution. The annual event is meant not to replace but to supplement the confirmation and Sunday school instruction of the local congregation.


Destruction, Sadness and Peace

Tornado warnings! Tornado sirens! TV announcer says, "People in this area need to seek shelter immediately!"

Flash flood warnings! TV announcer says that everyone in a particular area needs to move to higher ground immediately.

These warnings have become all too familiar in the past few months. Many areas around the country have had damage from storms, but my focus has been on the Pilger, Nebraska and

surrounding area tornados, Rock Rapids, Iowa flooding and storms in the area around Casey and Adair, Iowa.



Disbelief: "I had such a beautiful house, farm and crops and in an instant it is all blown away."

Anger: "Why did this happen to me?"

Acceptance: "My family is OK. The rest is just stuff!"


Confusion: "What will I do now? Where will I live? I have a job but I have no transportation. How will I get to work?"

Regret: "I didn't have flood insurance. The \$800 a year for flood insurance was just too much to pay and now I sit here with everything from my basement and first floor destroyed by the water."

Reflection: "My second job blew away and now I am looking at that as a good thing. I have been thinking a lot and decided to not start it again. It provides money for my family but I never see my family. I have decided that my family needs my time more than the money I get from my second job."

Determination: "We will rebuild our lives. We are not victims, we are survivors!"

Appreciation: "We recently moved here from Florida. We are blown away by the generosity of the people in Iowa. We would have received no help if we were still in Florida if this happened there. We are so happy to live in Iowa."

Patience: "Waiting for the over-worked insurance company."

Sadness: "My life is on the curb. We couldn't save anything after the water receded. Everything stinks and is ruined. We have flood insurance but it is still so hard to lose everything and to start over. I just had heart surgery a few months ago. This is tough!"

Hopeful: "You do not have any idea what it means to me to have you listen to me. I need to just talk. Your concern

for me and my family means so much to us. The things you have given us are very much appreciated, but even if you gave us nothing, the fact that you care is so very important. You give me hope."

Thankfulness: Because of the generosity of the people in Iowa District West, at this point, we were able to purchase used vehicles for three very thankful families in Nebraska. In Rock Rapids, Iowa there are thankful families for the over \$13,000 that Pastor Mark Hansen and I were able to share with them and the \$17,000 received from a grant we wrote from The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod World Relief and Human Care.

Overwhelmed: Farmers in Nebraska were blessed by God through Iowa District West people who were literally "God's hands and feet" as they walked the fields and picked up debris that would cause a big mess for a combine this fall.

Also as people in Rock Rapids were wondering what they would do with their mess, some people from Iowa came to help! God's people went to the fields and/or flooded homes to help those in need. They came from the areas around Polk City, Odebolt, Spencer, Terril, Clarinda, Jefferson, Perry, Manning, Manilla, Churdan, Arcadia, Lidderdale, Sioux City, Odebolt, Adel, Sanborn, Spirit Lake, Onawa, Rock Rapids, Ocheyden and more.

Why disasters? Why does God allow disasters? I don't know but I do see benefits as I work with people. In nearly every case, after a disaster, where I have worked with a church to reach out to their members and their community, the pastor or members say, "The disaster was the best thing that happened to our church. It woke us up! We are now a more caring church! We don't just go to church on Sunday, we now reach out and care for others."

After a disaster, many people have reconsidered the direction their life was going. If you were sitting on a cement slab where your house used to be, what would you be thinking about? It gets a person to think about a lot of things. Suddenly you realize that your life could be gone as your house is now gone. You think about your relationship with God, you wonder if you have been the person that you should be and you think about things that you need to change in your life.



This "diverse" group came from all Christian backgrounds, and were not all Lutheran. They came together at 1 pm on July 2 for a tour of the facilities.



Pictured is the HUGE CROWD that sent them off and prayed for these five missionaries.









Giving your IRA to your favorite ministries



Did you know that if you leave your IRA (or 401K, 403B, annuities, or other tax deferred retirement account) to your children at your death it will be subject to state and federal income taxes? These accounts are tax-free when given to a spouse but most people have given little thought to the tax consequences for these accounts when they name their children as the second beneficiary. If you are single, you probably

have named brothers, sisters, or nieces and nephews as beneficiaries of these accounts. They will have to pay income tax if they receive these accounts from you at your death.

A tax free way to distribute these accounts at your death is to name your favorite LCMS ministries including your local congregation as the beneficiary. These ministries are tax exempt and would not pay any income tax if they received some or all of your tax deferred account at your death. Our state and federal government are actually encouraging you to do this by giving these ministries their tax-exempt status. This form of giving is a little more complicated than simply writing out a check. A new beneficiary form needs to be secured and filled out properly. Some investment companies now require you to fill out the beneficiary form online. If you want to give the ministry some direction for your gift you will need to leave a letter of direction.
