"Dose of Wisdom"

Mark 9:2-9

2And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, 3and his clothes became radiant, intensely white, as no one on earth could bleach them. 4And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, and they were talking with Jesus. 5And Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." 6For he did not know what to say, for they were terrified. 7And a cloud overshadowed them, and a voice came out of the cloud, "This is my beloved Son; listen to him." 8And suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone with them but Jesus only.

9And as they were coming down the mountain, he charged them to tell no one what they had seen, until the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

This is the month of February. It is the month where there is a switch over from the season of Epiphany to the season of Lent. It is a time of listening to the words and seeing the actions of Jesus move over into the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We peak at the time of the Transfiguration of Jesus where Jesus is glorified in front of the disciples Peter, James, and John so they can have a glimpse of who Jesus is and what Jesus is about to undergo. It is a time where Peter speaks first then thinks second. "Rabbi, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." Peter got to see Jesus with Moses and Elijah! How awesome this would have been to see two greats that Peter would have known about from the Scriptures. He would have known about them from listening to Jesus preach and teach on the Old Testament. This was a great time and he wanted to stay in the moment. But God had other plans. God spoke from heaven and told Peter, James, and John to listen to Jesus. What did Jesus say to Peter, James, and John? He told them not to tell anyone what they had seen...until...the Son of Man had risen from the dead. He knew that if the disciples told about what happened at the mountain it would ruin Jesus' plan to go to the cross to suffer, die, and rise again for the people. They were not to say anything until after Jesus had risen from the dead. So naturally this Sunday of Transfiguration is the last Sunday before Lent, before Ash Wednesday. Transfiguration Sunday is a day for all disciples to listen to the voice of God saying, "Listen to Jesus." We do well to "Listen to Jesus". We take in His every Word of Life for the forgiveness of our sins. We live in peace on earth because of the forgiveness of sins in Jesus' name and through Jesus' Word. We walk with Jesus through the valley of the shadow of death. We witness the beatings, suffering, death, and resurrection for the forgiveness of our sins. That is what this month of February is about this year.

MIDWEEK OF LENT 1

HE ONLY HAS EYES FOR YOU

Isaiah 43:1-7

THEME VERSE

"You are valuable in My eyes." (Isaiah 43:4a)

THEME OF THE DAY

"God is faithful; God will never break His covenant of blood, signed when our Redeemer died, sealed when He was glorified" (LSB 435:4). These priceless promises come from the well-known hymn! "Come to Calvary's Holy Mountain." It summarizes the gist of Isaiah 43:1–7. Twenty-five times in these verses the prophet employs the word you. God says, "You are valuable in My eyes" (v. 4).

TEXTUAL NOTES

v. 1 Yahweh's fiery judgment speech (Isaiah 42:18–25) is followed by His gracious "but now." Up to this point in chapters 40–55, Isaiah announces that Yahweh created the heavenly lights (40:26), the earth's most distant places (40:28), and the heavens (42:5). Isaiah 41:19–20 announces Yahweh's new act of creation. Since *bara* ("create") in 43:1 is participial in form, Yahweh announces that His new creation is occurring *now* in His act of restoring the exiles.

The verb *yatsar* ("form") creates an inclusion in 43:1–7. It appears in verses 1b and 7b. The admonition "do not fear" comes in verses 1c and 5a. In the middle of this chiastic structure is Yahweh's deep love for His people, "Because you are precious in My eyes, [and] honored and I love you" (v. 4). Yahweh's care is cosmic and universal, to be sure, but to emphasize His exclusive love for *you*, He employs twenty-five second person singular words and suffixes in 43:1–7.

As cosmic Creator and Restorer, Yahweh commands His dearly loved people, "Fear not!" One thing the deportees might fear is Babylon's rulers, but they are formless nothings (40:23). Paul asserts that in this present age, authorities also oppose themselves to the will of God in Christ Jesus (e.g., Ephesians 3:10; 6:12). But we need not fear. God has destroyed death, our last enemy (1 Corinthians 15:26). "Yahweh is my light and my salvation, whom shall I fear?" (Psalm 27:1).

The expression, "I am calling you by name," is likened to Exodus 31:1 where Yahweh says, "I am calling by name Bezalel" (cf. 35:30). Other Israelites called by name include Samuel (1 Samuel 3:6, 10), Elijah (1 Kings 19:9, 13), Amos (7:8), and Jeremiah (1:11). Yahweh not only calls each star by name (Isaiah 40:26), but also has a most intimate love for Israel (Deuteronomy 7:7).

v. 2 Yahweh is present with His people in times of hardship. Two examples of His companionship "when you pass through the waters" are the passing through the Red Sea (Exodus 14:21–31; Psalm 66:12) and the crossing of the Jordan River into the Promised

SINGING WITH THE EXILES

Gathered by the waters of Babylon, Judean exiles wistfully wondered: Is God for real? If so, does He really care about us? What does our future hold? Will this ever change? God's people had watched their world shatter into a million pieces. They were demoralized and disillusioned. Their disaster looked terminal.

Do you feel this way? Does it look as though your current problems are more than you can bear? Do you find yourself asking: Why did this happen? Why did God allow it? Is there any order in the world? Will God really deliver on what He said?

Isaiah answers these questions in chapters 40–55 of his book. He announces that just when Israel's history seemed closed and controlled by hopeless Babylonian imperial policy, to the shock and surprise of everyone the Lord will stir up a king named Cyrus and a new exodus will explode in the desert! A Servant will be wounded for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities. And barren Zion will be given so many children that, like the old woman in the shoe, she won't know what to do! Standing behind these marvelous promises is God's almighty Word. "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever" (Isaiah 40:8). The exiles are going home!

That's why we are "Singing with the Exiles" as they are restored to their home.

This Lent, Isaiah 40–55 will shape us as we ...

Meditate upon daily devotions based upon these chapters; Study texts from Isaiah in Sunday morning adult Bible class; and Listen to the following sermons:

Ash Wednesday: "God Has a Word for That" (Isaiah 41:14-16)

Lent 1: "He Only Has Eyes for You" (Isaiah 43:1-7)

Lent 2: "Marked" (Isaiah 44:1-5)

Lent 3: "Breaking Down the Gates" (Isaiah 45:1-8)

Lent 4: "Get Out!" (Isaiah 48:17-22)

Lent 5: "One Little Word Can Fell Him" (Isaiah 49:1-6)

Holy Thursday: "He Prepares a Table" (Isaiah 49:7-13)

Good Friday: "All" (Isaiah 52:13-53:12)

Easter Vigil: "Nothing" (Isaiah 54:1-8)

Easter Sunday: "We Are Going Home" (Isaiah 55:6-13)

Plan now to sing with the exiles as we learn from Isaiah to walk the Lenten way to the cross and to the empty tomb. God promises to turn our weeping into joy and our present pain into an endless Alleluia!

Mealtime as a family

Amid busy and varied schedules, many families find a way to sit down together for dinner regularly. Family-health advocates describe the benefits: an increased sense of unity, children sharing news and feeling listened to, and the physical perks of a planned, seated meal.

In Scripture, many great encounters between people and God happen around meals. Abraham and Sarah prepare a meal for three guests who turn out to be angels (Genesis 18). God instructs the Hebrew slaves to eat a special meal together before their delivery from Egypt (Exodus 12); every year since, Jews have celebrated the Passover feast. Elijah is strengthened with food served by an angel (1 Kings 19). Jesus shares meals not only with religious leaders but with "sinners" (e.g., Matthew 9). Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples before his death has become one of the church's sacraments and a "foretaste" of the heavenly banquet to come.

When Christian families eat together, it's a holy time in God's presence, just as when the church shares Holy Communion — a true fellowship dinner!


