


ZION PROCLAIMER



In this month of March we continue to look at the series, Singing with the Exiles. It is a series built upon Isaiah 40-55. It helps us see Lent through the eyes of the Exiles in Babylon during the book of Isaiah. Below is an insert CPH said we could use for Newsletter Articles. So please join us on Wednesdays at 11:00 or 6:00 with a meal following the 11:00 service and a meal before the 6:00 service. God's blessings on your Lenten journey this year.

Gathered by the waters of Babylon, Judean exiles wistfully wondered: Is God for real? If so, does He really care about us? What does our future hold? Will this ever change? God's people had watched their world shatter into a million pieces. They were demoralized and disillusioned. Their disaster looked terminal.

Do you feel this way? Does it look as though your current problems are more than you can bear? Do you find yourself asking: Why did this happen? Why did God allow it? Is there any order in the world? Will God really deliver on what He said?

Isaiah answers these questions in chapters 40–55 of his book. He announces that just when Israel's history seemed closed and controlled by hopeless Babylonian imperial policy, to the shock and surprise of everyone the Lord will stir up a king named Cyrus and a new exodus will explode in the desert! A Servant will be wounded for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities. And barren Zion will be given so many children that, like the old woman in the shoe, she won't know what to do! Standing behind these marvelous promises is God's almighty Word. "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever" (Isaiah 40:8). The exiles are going home!

That's why we are "Singing with the Exiles" as they are restored to their home.

This Lent, Isaiah 40–55 will shape us as we . . .

Meditate upon daily devotions based upon these chapters; *Study* texts from Isaiah in Sunday morning adult Bible class; and

Listen to the following sermons:

Ash Wednesday: "God Has a Word for That" (Isaiah 41:14-16)

Lent 1: "He Only Has Eyes for You" (Isaiah 43:1-7)

Lent 2: "Marked" (Isaiah 44:1-5)

Lent 3: "Breaking Down the Gates" (Isaiah 45:1–8)

Lent 4: "Get Out!" (Isaiah 48:17–22)

Lent 5: "One Little Word Can Fell Him" (Isaiah 49:1–6)

Holy Thursday: "He Prepares a Table" (Isaiah 49:7–13)

Good Friday: "All" (Isaiah 52:13–53:12)

Easter Vigil: "Nothing" (Isaiah 54:1-8)

Easter Sunday: "We Are Going Home" (Isaiah 55:6-13)

Plan now to sing with the exiles as we learn from Isaiah to walk the Lenten way to the cross and to the empty tomb. God promises to turn our weeping into joy and our present pain into an endless Alleluia!

Small Stewards - Big Blessings By Rev. Bob Riggert Biblical Stewardship Lessons for and with Children

(You are invited to share these lessons with children in Sunday school openings, classroom devotions, children's worship lessons, or other church settings. They can also be used in the home for family devotions. Each month a biblical "small steward" will share a "big blessing" as a Spirit-blessed example of stewardship. The "Notes to Family" can be detached and sent home with the children.)

Text: 2 Chronicles 34:1-21

The eight year olds in our lives may be stewards of their math book, ball glove, video game, or other routine possessions. Eight year old King Josiah was steward of an entire kingdom. The grandfather and father of the boy king had both been unfaithful to the God of Israel. 2 Chronicles 34:2 compliments Josiah, "He did what was right in the eyes of the Lord, and walked in the ways of David his father.' King Josiah removed the idols and repaired the temple. God's Word was again found in the temple. Reading again of God's will for His people, Josiah led the nation in repentance and worship of the true God again.

Reading God's Word, Josiah and the people heard again of God's promises of a Savior. God would send the perfect King who was the fulfilment of God's Word. King Jesus would make it possible for all of us to be in the Kingdom of God forever.

The children in our church and the children in our family, most likely won't be anointed kings and won't be stewards of vast treasures. God asks all of us to be faithful managers of the things He has given us. He may even challenge us to be steward leaders in our school, team, family, and other places. We can be bold in looking for idols that keep us away from God. We can find and share the truth of God's Word with others.
