Luke 1:1-4

¹Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the things that have been accomplished among us, ²just as those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word have delivered them to us, ³it seemed good to me also, having followed all things closely for some time past, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, ⁴that you may have certainty concerning the things you have been taught.

May has always seemed be a "bittersweet" month. It is bitter with regards to the end of the school year. Anytime you have the end of something it is always a little bit bitter. Students and teachers part ways for the school year and students sometimes don't see their classmates for the entire summer until the next school year. There are a lot of things about the end of the school year that seem to be bitter.

There are also some things that are sweet. The summer vacation has begun. To quote the popular rock song, "School's out for summer, schools out forever." Well ok, not forever for everyone only for those not choosing to go on to some secondary education in technical school or university. There are some "sweet" freedoms the kids are looking forward to when school is out.

Let us now shift our focus to the church. At the end of the "school year" a lot of our Bible Classes and Catechesis come to an end. This is also a "bittersweet" time for me as a pastor. All of the excitement of the Bible Classes and Catechesis classes seem to be over for a while. We offer VBS at the beginning of summer, but after that we seem to be pretty slow over summer at church.

Does this mean that learning and education have to stop over the summer? No. Look at the text from Luke 1 above. Luke wrote the Gospel that bears his name for Theophilus. Theophilus literally means God-Lover or Lover of God. Was this an actual person or was it a description of someone else? We don't know for sure. But the word for "taught" is the same form of the word catechesis. It is teaching the faith with the result that one turns from their sins and to faith in Christ Jesus for forgiveness.

There are a lot of things you can continue to learn this summer even though we might not offer classes at Zion. There are good books to learn from that I would recommend you reading this summer. Here is a list of the books to read and discuss over the summer with your family or other congregation members.





Over the years, Memorial Day has become a big holiday weekend. It's now the unofficial start of summer, rather than a day of tribute to the departed it was originally meant to be.

Even if we plan fun events for Memorial Day weekend, it's important to stop long enough to bow our heads and pay respect to our departed loved ones — especially those who fell in battle while helping preserve America's liberties.

Let us take time to make the pilgrimage to various cemeteries and pause long enough to say, "Thank you, Father, for these special lives, for sacrifices made and for friendships we have shared."

The price of freedom

In the song "What Did He Die For?" Twila Paris reminds us why we observe Memorial Day — and why we worship Jesus as our Savior. The first verse tells of a 21-year-old soldier fighting for America's freedom during World War II. The second verse recalls another young man, many centuries prior, sent by his Father to win eternal freedom from sin for the entire world.

The chorus offers this challenge:

"What did he die for when he died for you and me,

Made the sacrifice so that we could all be free?

I believe we will answer each to heaven

For the way we spend a priceless liberty.

Look inside and ask the question, What did he die for?"

Memorial Day challenges us to live so as to honor the sacrifices made by members of the military. We value our freedom because of the heavy price people have paid for it. Likewise, every day we're challenged to live so as to honor Jesus' supreme sacrifice. He calls us to spend our "priceless liberty" using our blessings to bless others.

How will they know?

A well-known 1960s song by Peter Scholtes answers an implied question: How will others know we're Jesus' disciples? Not by how we understand family values. Not by our politics or theology. Not by how many Bible verses we've memorized, how often we attend church or how much offering we give.

Rather, the song's title and refrain say it all: "They'll know we are Christians by our love." Jesus put it this way: "Everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:35, NIV).

Sometimes love involves words — teaching, proclaiming, bearing witness to God's presence.


Going to Nigeria?


