In last month's Dose of Wisdom I wrote about the Augsburg Confession as it was the 485th Anniversary of the reading of that document before Emperor Charles V from Spain in Augsburg, Germany. The Augsburg Confession is one of many writings contained in a larger book called **The Book of Concord.** This book is the book which defines what it is we as Lutherans believe, teach, and confess from the Holy Scriptures. As I attended the Installation of Pastor Wagner at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Lidderdale on Sunday I heard once again these questions given to the pastor and congregation at an Installation of a Pastor; (my emphasis added)

(To The Pastor)

- **P** Do you believe and confess the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice?
- Yes, I believe and confess the canonical Scriptures to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
- P Do you believe and confess the three Ecumenical Creeds, namely the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds, as faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors which they condemn?
- Yes, I believe and confess the three Ecumenical Creeds because they are in accord with the Word of God. I also reject all the errors they condemn.
- P Do you confess the Unaltered Augsburg Confession to be a true exposition of Holy Scripture and a correct exhibition of the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church? And do you confess that the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Small and Large Catechisms of Martin Luther, the Smalcald Articles, the Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope, and the Formula of Concord—as these are contained in the Book of Concord—are also in agreement with this one scriptural faith?
- R Yes, I make these Confessions my own because they are in accord with the Word of God.
- P Do you promise that you will perform the duties of your office in accordance with these Confessions, and that all your preaching and teaching and your administration of the Sacraments will be in conformity with Holy Scripture and with these Confessions?

 P Yes, I promise, with the help of God.
- P Will you faithfully instruct both young and old in the chief articles of Christian doctrine, will you forgive the sins of those who repent, and will you promise never to divulge the sins confessed to you? Will you minister faithfully to the sick and dying, and will you demonstrate to the Church a constant and ready ministry centered in the Gospel? Will you admonish and encourage the people to a lively confidence in Christ and in holy living?
- Yes, I will, with the help of God.
- P Finally, will you honor and adorn the Office of the Holy Ministry with a holy life? <u>Will</u> <u>you be diligent in the study of Holy Scripture and the Confessions?</u> And will you be constant in prayer for those under your pastoral care?

R I will, the Lord helping me through the power and grace of His Holy Spirit.

(To the Congregation)

- P Beloved in the Lord, Holy Scripture says, "Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you."
- P You have heard the solemn promise of him called to be your pastor. Will you receive him, show him that love, honor, and obedience in the Lord that you owe to the shepherd and teacher placed over you by your Lord Jesus Christ, and will you support him by your gifts and pray for him always that in his labors he may retain a cheerful spirit and that his ministry among you may be abundantly blessed? If so, then answer: We will, with the help of God.

Will you honor and uphold your pastor as he serves Christ in all his **God-pleasing responsibilities?** Will you aid him as he cares for his family? Will you be diligent to "put the best construction on everything," recognizing that "love covers a multitude of sins"? If so, then answer: We will, with the help of God.

@ We will, with the help of God.

So we see in these questions and answers that the Pastor is to pledge himself to the Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions. The congregation is to help and pray for him to do his God given responsibilities within the congregation meaning to stay true to the Holy Scriptures and The Lutheran Confessions. We looked at last week how the Constitution of Zion Lutheran Church explained the importance of the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions in Article 2. "This congregation acknowledges and accepts all the canonical books of the Old New Testament as the revealed Word of God, verbally inspired, and acknowledges and accepts all the Confessional Writings of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, contained in the Book of Concord of the year 1580, to be the true and genuine exposition of the doctrines of the Bible. These Confessional Writings are the three Ecumenical Creeds (Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian), the Unaltered Augsburg Confession, the Smalcald Articles, Luther's Large and Small Catechisms, and the Formula of Concord." So next week we will look at the Three Ecumenical Creeds. I also strongly encourage you to read through this little explanation below. (Once again my emphasis added.)

CONFESSIONAL SUBSCRIPTION: AN EVANGELICAL ACT

Lutherans have always held that creeds and confessions are necessary for the well-being of the church. Just as Christ's church and all Christians are called upon to confess their faith (Matt. 10:32; Rom. 10:9; 1 Peter 3:15; 1 John 4:2), so the church, if it is to continue to proclaim the pure Gospel in season and out of season, must for many reasons construct formal and permanent symbols and confessions and require pastors and teachers to subscribe these confessions. It is impossible for the church to be a nonconfessional church, just as impossible as to be a nonconfessing church. And so today and ever since the Reformation Lutheran churches over the world have required their pastors to subscribe the Lutheran Confessions.

What does this mean? With her confessions the church is speaking to the world, but also to God, who has spoken to her in His Word—speaking to Him in total commitment, speaking to Him by an unequivocal, unconditional response in the spirit of, "We believe, teach, and confess" (FC Ep, Rule and Norm, 1). This response is Scriptural, taken from Scripture itself. How often do we read in our Confessions that the teaching presented is "grounded in God's Word"! And so the Confessions are no more than a kind of "comprehensive summary, rule, and norm," grounded in the Word of God, "according to which all doctrines should be judged and the errors which intruded should be explained and decided in a Christian

way" (FC Ep, Heading). This would be an **unbelievably arrogant** position to take, were it not for the fact that all the doctrine of our Confessions is diligently and faithfully drawn from Scripture.

And so when the Lutheran pastor subscribes the Lutheran Confessions (and the confirmand or layman confesses his belief in the Catechism [LC, Preface, 19]), this is a primary way in which he willingly and joyfully and without reservation or qualification confesses his faith and proclaims to the world what his belief and doctrine and confession really are. Dr. C. F. W. Walther, the father of the Missouri Synod, long ago explained the meaning of confessional subscription, and his words are as cogent today as when they were first written. [From Walther's essay delivered at the Western District Convention, 1858.]

An unconditional subscription is the solemn declaration which the individual who wants to serve the church makes under oath (1) that he accepts the *doctrinal content* of our Symbolical Books, because he recognizes the fact that it is in full agreement with Scripture and does not militate against Scripture in any point, whether that point be of major or minor importance; (2) that he therefore heartily believes in this divine truth and is determined to preach this doctrine.... Whether the subject be dealt with expressly or only incidentally, an unconditional subscription refers to the whole content of the Symbols and does not allow the subscriber to make any mental reservation in any point. Nor will he exclude such doctrines as are discussed incidentally in support of other doctrines, because the fact that they are so stamps them as irrevocable articles of faith and demands their joyful acceptance by everyone who subscribes the Symbols.

This is precisely how the Confessions themselves understand subscription (FC Ep, Rule and Norm, 3, 5, 6; SD, Rule and Norm, 1, 2, 5).

Needless to say, confessional subscription in the nature of the case is binding and unconditional. A subscription with qualifications or reservations is a contradiction in terms and dishonest.

Today many Lutherans claim that such an unconditional subscription is legalistic. Sometimes they assert that such a position is pompous and not even honest.

We might respond: What can possibly be wrong about confessing our faith freely and taking our confession seriously? For it is the freest and most joyful act in the world for those of us who have searched these great confessional writings and found them to be Scriptural and evangelical to subscribe them. Of course, to force or bribe or wheedle a person into subscribing them would be an awful sin and a denial of what our Confessions are, namely symbols, standards around which Christians rally willingly and joyfully in all their Christian freedom.




Awards Sunday August 30, 2015




IT'S OFFICIAL! WE ARE NOW AN IOWA DISTRICT WEST CHURCH

After 15 years of mission work in the Denison Hispanic community, God has blessed our congregation with the joy of becoming part of lowa District West. Our church received the approval of the District Convention on June 22 at Camp Okoboji. As the pictures at the right show, our representatives came forward as the delegates voted by voice vote followed by singing the Doxology. It was a great moment for our church and for the District as this is the first Spanish language church to be received into membership in Iowa District West. We thank President Sieveking, Missions Executive Mark Gerken and all the District churches for the years of support for our ministry. That work was evident at the Convention as another resolution was overwhelmingly passed by 98% of the delegates to "Bring Christ to the Hispanic People of Iowa District West."

The representatives of our congregation were the following two families: Jose Domingo Mendoza and wife Marbella, daughter Adriana and granddaughter, Yamilet. They are originally from Mexico. The other family (with the same last name but not related) was Marcia Mendoza and her children, Moises, Jasmin and Laura. They are originally from El Salvador. Both families made special sacrifices to be present for this ceremony. It has been a long process to reach this milestone, a process that our Hispanic members have never experienced. Now the work begins as we develop leadership, stewardship plans, evangelistic outreach and much more. At present we have 28 confirmed members and 50 baptized members with an average attendance of 25-35. May the Lord continue to bless.



NEW YOUTH GROUP




