"DOSE OF WISDOM"

This month's Dose of Wisdom is about the Augsburg Confession. I wrote about this Confession of Faith back in June, but would like to write a little bit more on the history and background of the writing. What I have below is pieces from *Concordia; The Lutheran Confessions*. These words are not my own, but taken from the book. The Augsburg Confession matters to us today because in it lays the foundation of what we believe, teach, and confess as Lutherans. And actually as you will read below, laymen read the Confession before the Emperor, the most powerful man in the world at the time of the Augsburg Confession, 1530. It took great faith and courage for those who were influenced by the teachings of Luther to make this bold confession of faith in front of such an audience. May we pray to God for such faith and great boldness today.

II. The Lutheran Confessions

The **Augsburg Confession** was written by Melanchthon in 1530. Emperor Charles V had invited the Lutheran princes and theologians to attend a meeting of government leaders at Augsburg. He wanted to discuss how the religious controversy in his Empire could be settled, so that German Lutheran princes would join the Imperial forces to keep the Turks out of Europe. The Augsburg Confession is composed from several documents that already existed but which were combined by Melanchthon to give a clear but conciliatory summary of the teachings and practices of the Lutheran congregations. To this day it is the basic Lutheran confession.

The **Apology (or defense) of the Augsburg Confession** was published in 1531. After the Augsburg Confession had been read to the emperor, a committee of Romanist theologians prepared a reply called the Confutation. The Apology defends the Augsburg Confession against the accusations of the Confutation.

Editor's Introduction to the Augsburg Confession

On Saturday, June 25, 1530, at three o'clock in the afternoon, Dr. Christian Beyer stood, walked toward the Emperor of the Holy Roman Empire, Charles V, and began reading the Augsburg Confession in a loud and distinct voice. Through the open windows a hushed crowd outside in the courtyard hung on his every word, as did the two hundred or so people gathered in the hall. Beside Dr. Beyer stood Dr. Gregory Bruck, holding a copy of the Augsburg Confession in Latin. The German princes around them stood up to indicate their support for the Confession. The emperor motioned for them to sit down.

When Dr. Beyer finished reading, Dr. Bruck took the German copy of the Confession from him, handed both copies to the emperor, and said, "Most gracious Emperor, this is a Confession that will even prevail against the gates of hell, with the grace and help of God." Thus was the Augsburg Confession presented as a unique Confession of the truth of God's holy Word, distinct from Romanism on the one hand, and Reformed, Anabaptists, and radicals on the other. June 25, 1530, is a date every bit as important for Lutherans as is the more familiar date of October 31, 1517—the day on which Luther posted his Ninety-five Theses.

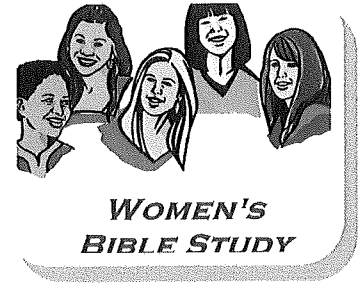

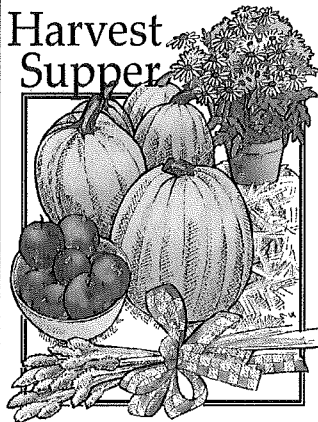

Setting a good example

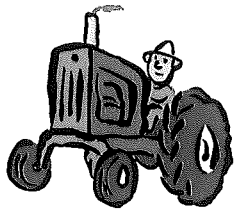
Some friends gathered after the funeral of a dear, saintly man. They all knew how dedicated he was to God, his church and his family.

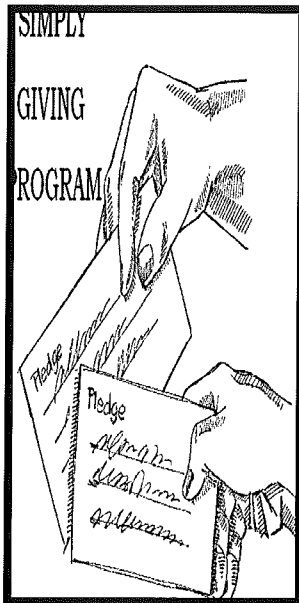
Even though the boy's grandfather was no longer alive, his godly example was having a lasting impact on his family — an impact that will touch future generations for years to come.

HARVEST ACCOUNT

As in the past several years many members of Zion have offered their thanks to the Lord at harvest by presenting a part of their harvest to the Lord. If you would like to offer a gift to the Lord you can do so by letting the Arcadia Elevator know how many bushels of corn or beans you would like to give and that it is for Zion's Harvest Account



In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. Special services like Advent, Lent, Christmas, etc are NOT automatically deducted and we would encourage you to use your offering envelopes for those services just like in the past. For each person our Financial Secretary has to handle 52 envelopes and bookkeeping entries per year, and when you multiply that by approximately 275 envelope numbers, that is a significant amount of work that could be avoided by using the Simply Giving Program. An additional bonus would be that our giving throughout the year would be more consistent. We prayerfully ask that you consider making this small change that would be of big help. Likewise, if I had not gone to church for nourishment, I would be spiritually dead today!" When you are DOWN to nothing... God is UP to something! Faith sees the invisible, believes the incredible and receives the impossible! Thank God for our physical AND our spiritual nourishment!

All right, now that you're done reading, send it on! I think everyone should read this! When Satan is knocking at your door, simply say, "Jesus, could you get that for me? Amen!!

BUILDING FUND.....the account that pays for the loan on the elevator

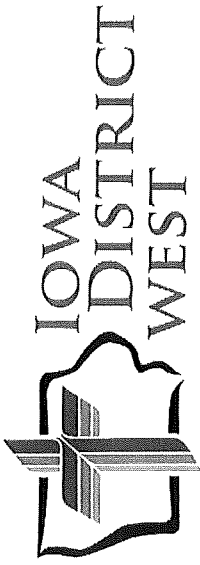

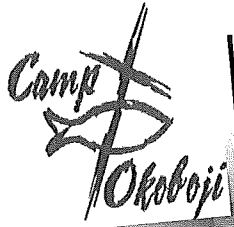
