"DOSE OF WISDOM"

There is no doubt in my mind; this is my favorite time of year. We have so much going on and so much to be thankful for in the fall. There is the harvest going on, football, colder weather, the leaves changing colors, Halloween, hunting, fishing, and the list could go on and on.

October is also the month we celebrate the Reformation. It is a month where we focus one Sunday or more on remembering the basics of our faith; Jesus Christ and Him Crucified. It is always a temptation to romanticize the Reformation like it was a "golden" age where things were great and everyone was getting along and there was this new wave of emphasis on the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. But when we look more deeply at the Reformation we know it was anything but a "golden" age in the Church. Luther was so anxious about the changes he was trying to make his health suffered a great deal. His life was in jeopardy following the Diet of Worms in 1521. There was a bounty on Luther's head. This is why he was hid in the Castle Wartburg for 321 days in Eisenach, Germany. This is the place where Martin Luther translated the New Testament from Greek to Latin to German. Luther married in 1525 and he was constantly worried his wife would be a widow from his poor health or from dying a martyr's death. There were Luther's close colleagues who took his teachings to a place where Luther did not intend them to go. The peasant's revolt was started by one of Luther's colleagues who took his teachings and ran with them declaring the peasants had the right to take what they could by force. He also taught that they need not be under the priests and the government. Somehow he thought he was taking Luther's teachings and making them applicable in the life of the common people. Luther was upset about this and set his colleague straight. There was a young student and friend of Luther's who was burnt at the stake for defending the teachings of Luther in his homeland of the Netherlands.

So with confessing the truth of God's Word there will be tribulation, there will be suffering. Even as the Lutheran church separated from the Roman Catholic Church there was an opportunity once again to confess the faith. On June 25, 1530 the Lutherans were summoned to a meeting in Augsburg, Germany to explain their teachings to Holy Roman Emperor. This was a momentous occasion, as the Lutheran theologians and princes are quoted as saying, *"Before my lord would take the Word of God from me, I will kneel and offer him my head."* One by one the Lutherans who were gathered began kneeling offering their heads to the government leaders. They were able to read their confession of faith to the emperor and his company. The Lutherans opened the door to religious freedom in 1530. This is the faith that we continue to hold fast to today. It is the teachings as we know them to be faithful and true expositions of God's Word. Each Lutheran church has on its cornerstone UAC, it is a symbol to signify that this church confesses the faith as found in the Bible and the Unaltered Augsburg Confession.

What does the Reformation mean for us today? It means it is still and always will be about Jesus. It is Jesus, pure and undefiled, pure grace and forgiveness from His death and resurrection. It is all Jesus all the time. This next year 2017 we will celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation. It was on October 31, 1517 Luther nailed the 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. So in the year 2017 we will celebrate at different times the Lutheran Reformation throughout the year. This is and will be an exciting event to think about the blessings God has showered on His church since 1517. Yes it was a long time ago this event took place, but it has benefits now and into eternity.

In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. Special services like Advent, Lent, Christmas, etc are NOT automatically deducted and we would encourage you to use your offering envelopes for those services just like in the past. An additional bonus would be that our giving throughout the year would be more consistent. We prayerfully ask that you consider making this small change that would be of big help. 
FARM BIDS: Sealed bids for renting the church farm are now being accepted. **The bids need to be received in the church office by Sunday, November 6th** at 11 am.

Dear Members of Zion:

We have reached the point in the year where we work on next year's budget. If you haven't already done so, we encourage you to come to Church, take an endowment paper and give us suggestions on how the endowment fund should be spent. In Galatians 6:2, God tells us to "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." Your suggestions help us determine how to use the endowment fund for a variety of worthwhile missions, charitable projects and evangelism outreach activities.

Please be aware the endowment fund cannot be used for operating expenses, such as health insurance, salaries, wages, office supplies and utilities. As the cost for these items increases each year, and as summer attendance and giving decreased, we had a shortfall of funds for the operating budget this summer, and we currently have a loan at the Westside bank for \$7,000.00 to cover the shortfall. Please give careful consideration and prayer to help us get this loan paid off so we can continue to reach our goals and objectives here at Zion.

Reminder: Have you considered the simply giving program? Even the most committed churchgoers will occasionally miss services and weekly offerings, due to illness, poor weather or vacation. It's convenient, safe and simple. It also guarantees the Church can depend on your regular offering amount, even when you are away. Would you please consider this commitment to the Church?
