"DOSE OF WISDOM"

Philippians 2:5-7

⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus,^[a] ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped,^[b] ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant,^[c] being born in the likeness of men.

While flipping through the radio stations on our way home from Des Moines last weekend celebrating Thanksgiving with our families we came across 104.1 from Des Moines and they were playing the song, "It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year." It got me thinking, "Yes it is the most wonderful time of the year." But we must take a step back and remember that before we get to full blown Christmas celebrations we meditate on the slowness of the season of Advent. Yes, Advent. Advent is a season that we like to rush past and quickly get to Christ in the manger at Bethlehem. In our haste, we miss the time to stop and relax waiting and meditating on what it means to wait. In this culture we live in everything happens fast and we expect everything to happen fast and if it doesn't we become upset. So during this Advent season, slow...down...and...wait... with expectation and anticipation for Christ to come as a baby, but also think about what it means for Christ to come at the end of the world or think about what it means when you meet Christ upon your death. During this time think about what it means that Christ comes to you in the Word and the Sacraments. If you notice the hymns we sing during the season of Advent, they focus very much on the waiting and anticipation for Christ to come into the presence of His people.

You can come to church on Wednesdays either in the morning at 11:00 or at 6:30 in the evening. These services, hymns, readings, and meditations will focus on waiting for Christ to come to His people. You can do a Google search on the Hymns of Advent and you will be surprised about how many Christians still celebrate the season of Advent. You can create a station on Pandora (one of many streaming music stations) for Advent Antiphon or Advent Meditations. Take time this Advent season to slow down and ponder the mystery that is God coming to earth in human flesh and blood to be one of His people, us, to save His people from their sins. Take time to listen to podcasts from Issues Etc. Lutheran Talk Radio at Issuesetc.org and subscribe free to their Podcast on iTunes. They discuss the readings for the upcoming Sunday as well as look at hymns of the season of Lent. Yes all of this is almost too much to comprehend. This where faith overcomes reason and simply lets us soak in the joy of Christ's birth at Bethlehem.

Yes, "It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year", because of the mystery of Christ coming down to be one of us to save us from our sins. Meditate, ponder, wonder, read and rejoice this Advent and Christmas season.

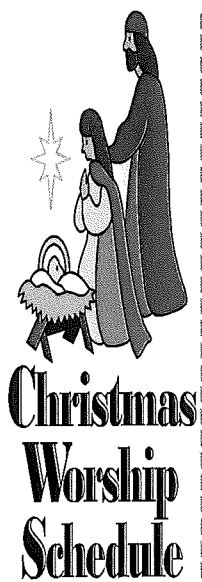
Another project of the Ladies Aid and Evening Circle are School Kits. Items that are needed for school kits include: spiral notebooks, blunt scissors, ruler (need cm also marked) pencil sharpeners, #2 pencils, pink erasers, construction paper, crayons (16-24 count)

A Lutheran World Relief school kit may provide the only supplies for children returning to school after the disruption of war. School kits help parents continue their children's education even while living in a refugee camp, for example. A school kit may also be used in adult literacy classes.

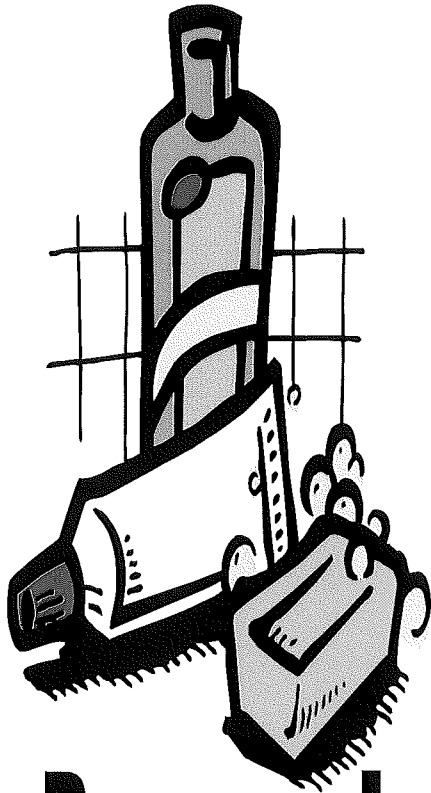

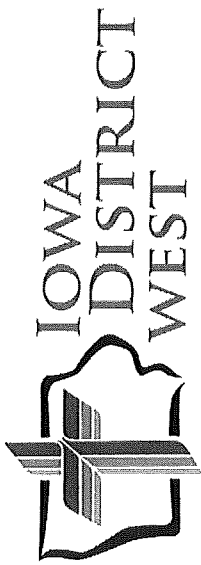

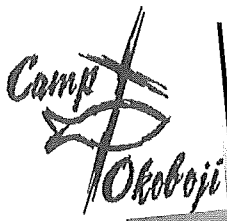
A Christmas Note from President Turner

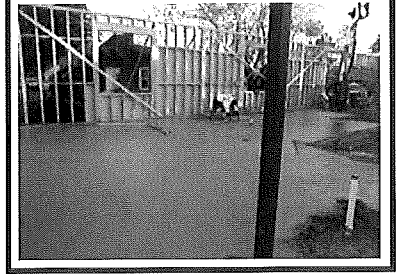

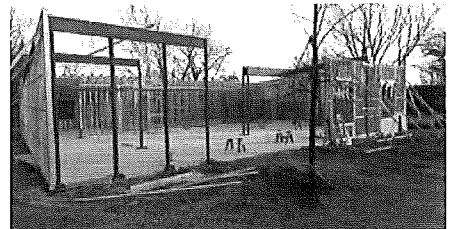
