I would like to take some time to thank you all for the cards, phone calls, texts, emails, and Facebook posts regarding my health during my hospitalization during November. It was a frightening time when the doctors said, "This is a critical event." and "You survived a very life threatening situation." It was during those times, I was in awe of God's mercy. I don't know why or how I survived this ordeal. It was by the grace of God only that I can write this today. My prognosis is to be on blood thinners for the rest of my life. This is not exactly what I want, but it is something right now that is needed. So I need to make some adjustments to my life now, but it is all worth it to live and enjoy life from day to day. I thank you for praying for me during this time. I can continue to be your pastor and serve you as one of Christ's sheepdogs.

This month of December is a full one! It is filled with services which draw our attention to Christ. It is Christ's birth and second coming we anticipate this Advent season. Advent means "to come". So in Advent we are waiting for Christ to come, 1. We prepare for Jesus to come at His birth in Bethlehem. 2. We also prepare and anticipate the coming of Jesus at the end of the world. In our waiting we come together to celebrate Christ's presence and forgiveness with us now. We gather on Sunday mornings at 10:00 for Divine Service. We also gather at 11:00 and 6:30 during the Wednesday evenings of Advent. We gather because it is a common thing for Christians to come together and pray, read Scripture, and sing God's praises. This is a time of fellowship in the midst of a crazy and busy week to hear of the coming of Jesus. We can be strengthened with other believers who are going through the same challenges and joys of the Christian life throughout the week. So come and join us on Wednesdays at either 11:00 or 6:30.

Also this month we have special services on Christmas Eve at 5:00 and 11:00 pm. The 5:00 Service will be the children in Sunday school leading the readings for this service. It is a service of participation from both the children, but also the congregation. It is not your standard Christmas "Program" but rather an actual service. The 11:00 will be the service of candlelight with Holy Communion. On Christmas Day we have the celebratory 9:00 service that will announce Christ's birth for the salvation of the entire world. There are many opportunities to celebrate the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ for the salvation of the whole world. Come and join us for this celebration!!

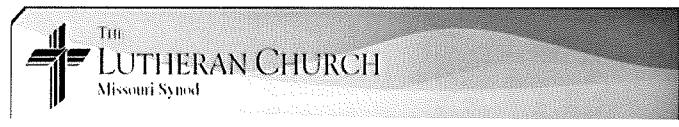
On New Year's Eve we remember God's grace and reflect upon the past year and pray for God's blessings on the New Year. We will have this service at 6:00.

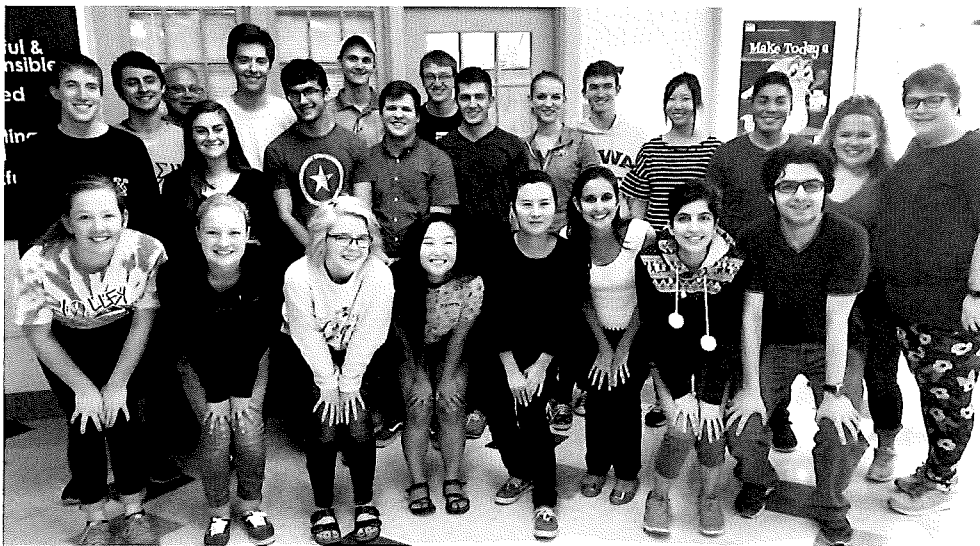
Three Cheers for Moulton Volunteers

Music and Sport's Day at Moulton Elementary School in Des Moines was a day designed to bring smiles to the children and teachers. Seventy-five volunteers shared their Saturday morning with 225 children and parents at Moulton. Moulton is a school that has over 500 students. These students are refugees or immigrants who have come from 31 countries. Twenty-seven languages are spoken at the school.



Thanks to Pastor Aaron Hannemann's organization, they enjoyed volleyball, basketball, soccer and baseball.

Also a big thank you to Kathryn Sprecher, Susan Hermann, Connie Mekus and Pastor Bill and Angela Weiss who had fun buying 600 bottles of water, 500 hot dogs and buns, 600 cookies, juice, bars, pudding, etc. Thank you to Brotherhood Mutual Insurance Company-American Church Group for funding the food.



When most people think about Iowa State University, they are thinking about sports. If you already cheer for ISU, here's another reason to do so. Three cheers for the 23 international and music students who volunteered their time and talent to be part of the events of the day.

Judy Newhouse, International Student Ministry Coordinator at Memorial Lutheran Church in Ames, shared, "I have taken college and international students twice to help with the Music and Sports Day at Moulton. At the last Music and Sports Day, I met Rina Lopez. She shared that at Moulton, they started teaching English classes for the parents. I started to think about the international students at Memorial. Why couldn't the international students who are taking English classes at Memorial Lutheran in Ames help by teaching basic English classes?"

“That is exactly what we are doing! I recently took four international students (and more are signing up) to help with the lunch and recess time and then they taught an hour of English classes for the parents. It is great to see the excitement of my international students. They are so excited to be able to give back and help others. It is truly a win-win situation! God is good.”

Why a Music/Craft Day? Jena Nahnsen shared, “I went to one of Ellie's LERT trainings in my hometown last year. After the training, we were talking about different service projects they were doing. She shared that IOWAY volunteers had a Sports and Craft Day last March at Moulton and was looking for a new idea for the upcoming camp. I suggested doing a music day because music connects everyone regardless of language. (The inspiration of this thought came from a YoYo Ma documentary I had just watched the week before.) We started brain storming what we could do for projects. The original idea was to bring in ISU music students and do an "instrumental petting zoo" where the kids would be able to see instruments up close and learn how each works. Then we decided we should encourage them to enjoy music regardless of how much money they have, because let's face it, instruments are expensive. We came up with the idea of making instruments out of everyday items and showing them that they have the ability to make music regardless of the current situation they are in. I feel that it went really well and hope to have another Music Day in Moulton in the future.”

The following thoughts were shared by Iowa State/Memorial Lutheran students:

Jacob Larimore – “I found the Moulton Elementary experience to be very enjoyable. Watching the little kids put all their energy into a lenient game of soccer reminded me of when I was their age, having a blast kicking the ball around.”

Jacob Metzler – “It was such a humbling experience for me. I always tell people to focus on the small things in life. What I think will stick with me the most is interacting with a young boy who seemed to understand this so well. His focus for the day was to make a shaker that looked nice for his mom. He wouldn't let himself go play sports, which he really wanted to do, until he had made it for her. Seeing this selflessness, even about something as small as a little shaker, in a boy so young left me feeling inspired as I walked out of the school that day.”

Misa Hamanaka – “I had an absolutely amazing time and am so happy I got to be part of such a fun event! I really enjoyed getting to watch the children, including the ones who were unsure at first about making these instruments. They showed extreme creativity and made music out of the instruments they made themselves.”

Huan Zhou (ISU Instructor of Economics) – “Through the Moulton Elementary experience, I have a better understanding of the value of serving others and I learned the positive impact that we can have on the lives we touch. Also, I have always been happiest when I tend to kid's needs ahead of my own and I really enjoyed it.”

Luke Heilman – “It was really eye opening to see kids in such great need, especially since they are right here in Iowa and not in another country. It was neat to see the immediate impact we made on the kids, too.”
