"Dose of Wisdom"

Here we are to November already! This is a month where we look at the blessings we have and give thanks to God for those blessings. November is also the month in the Divine Service lectionary where we focus on the end of the world or Judgment Day. This is because the end of the Church Year is the Sunday before Advent begins. So with Advent there is a new Church Year. We will switch from Series A to Series B in the Lectionary Readings beginning the last Sunday in November. This means we will shift the focus from the Gospel of Matthew to the Gospel of Mark. I tend to get a bit excited for Series B as Mark is my favorite Gospel to read and study. Things happen very quickly in the Gospel of Mark. The Greek word for "immediately" is used many times over in this Gospel. Mark makes quick work of Jesus' ministry and life, suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension. His is the shortest of the four Gospels.

Now getting back to November we focus on the Apostles' Creed during November in Catechesis. We look at the 2nd & 3rd Articles and what they mean. We look at Jesus, the Son of God and His work of redemption in the 2nd Article. Then we look at the third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit and His work of sanctification. Redemption in the 2nd Article means Jesus has bought us back to Himself. He paid the price, the ransom for us to be released from Satan's bondage. The ransom Jesus paid was His blood shed on the cross for you me and you. Now we can serve Him in righteousness, innocence, and blessedness. The 3rd Article as we look at in November will deal with the Holy Spirit working on our behalf to create and sustain faith, as this is what sanctification means. It means the Holy Spirit is working in our lives through the Word and the Sacraments. The Holy Spirit never wants the spotlight to be put on Him, but always directs our attention to Jesus. His life, death, and resurrection are everything to us and for us. This is how the Holy Spirit wants it to be. The Holy Spirit helps us to live out our faith in good works toward our neighbor. Our neighbor is anyone who is outside of us and is need of good works from us.

In all that we do in November, let us remember to give thanks to God for providing for our every need. In the Old Testament Reading for the Thanksgiving service the Israelites are reminded in Deuteronomy 8 the Lord provided for their every need in the 40 years they were wandering in the wilderness. So we also need to see the Lord's provision in our lives as He has led us through so many wanderings and journeys in our lifetime. We give thanks to God for His grace and blessings in our lives this November and always.





Cornucopia, a Greek word meaning "horn of plenty," has origins in Greek mythology. But the cornucopia became a religious symbol and was even stamped on Jewish coins. Overflowing horns, now common as Thanksgiving centerpieces, came to symbolize abundance and blessings.

Giving thanks for all things

It's easy to list the blessings in life: good health, family, a satisfying career, a comfortable home. We might even be thankful for things others take for granted, such as freedom, clean drinking water, reliable transportation and food enough to eat. Then there are the little things, such as gardens, sunrises, pets and coffee.

What about life's storms or unanswered prayers? Should we be thankful for these? Loss and hardship remind us of our dependence on God. He uses trials to draw us closer to him, to show us that he is our rock and refuge. In misfortune and grief, we discover God's comfort and strength. Should we not, then, be thankful for the storms, too?

The beginning of Advent

November is the month of Thanksgiving, but it often also includes the beginning of a new church year. This year, December 6th is the first Sunday of Advent. The season of Advent is about Jesus, the Word, "coming." It's about anticipating and preparing for Christ's arrival.

God comes to us in many and various ways. He speaks to us through the prophets and saints. He comes and speaks to us when we are listening. He comes in the beauty and mysteries of nature. Most of all, God comes in the person of Christ, speaking to his listeners face to face.

Pastor Edmund Steimle put it this way: "The Christian story is a story of God coming into the middle of life, of our lives, opening the dialogue with us."

That's what Advent is really all about: God visiting the earth in person to speak with anyone and everyone who is ready to do so.

God's precious saints

A man mourning the sudden death of his young wife wondered, "Where was God when Jenny died?" Unable to sleep, he turned to Scripture and read Psalm 116:3 (NIV): "The anguish of the grave came upon me: I was overcome by trouble and sorrow." The man's anguish echoed the psalmist's. Reading on, he discovered verse 15: "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints."

"What does it mean by precious?" the man wondered. The footnote proved helpful: "Not in the sense of highly valued, but of that which is carefully watched over." The widower pictured God watching over his wife in her last moments. "That's where God was," the man thought with relief.

May we, too, be assured that God cares for his saints — not only at death but also in life, through grief and into healing.

Thanks, Iowa District West

There are so many needs in our world. How can we help? We cannot help everyone, but everyone can do something! It has been a whirlwind since the hurricane season started. After the hurricanes did their dirty work, we in Iowa District West reached out to Lutheran South Academy in Houston and to Zion Lutheran Church in Fort Myers, Florida. For

updates, go to <u>www.idwlcms.org</u> under District News. It has been and continues to be a privilege for me to work with God's people in Iowa District West who at this time have donated over \$66,500 for relief to Texas and Florida.

Gregg Pinick, CEO of Lutheran Education Association of Houston (LEAH) expressed his thanks to Iowa District West.



My first connection with Ellie Menz came on August 31, 2017. Ellie is the Director of IOWAY (Individual Outreach With Adults and Youth) for Iowa District West of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. She had heard that one of the LEAH School campuses, Lutheran South Academy (LSA), had been significantly flooded from the effects of Hurricane Harvey. She was calling to see if there was anything she could help us with as we recovered from the devastation. I'll never forget her telling me, "We have a semi-truck ready to come to you in Houston. What do you need?" I asked our response team, and we all agreed, "As much sheetrock as you can send us."

Harvey had just left the area. We had a major mess requiring that whole panels of sheetrock be removed from every wall of every one of our four buildings, and we weren't sure we could get any since everyone in the region was going to require sheetrock to rebuild. She responded, "No problem. I'll get right on it."

About a week later, she called saying she and her team could get another semi-truck and asked what else we needed. I told her we needed all the sheetrock supplies: mud, tape, etc. She stated that it was a big truck and they could bring anything for our workers who had lost much in the flood waters. We thought that was a terrific idea, and she went on to talk about how she could help the young children in our school as well. It was overwhelming. Then just like the first time, Ellie stated, "I'll get right on it!"



Less than three weeks later, our first shipment arrived at the LSA campus. It was a semi-load of 702 pieces of sheetrock. The driver, Troy, was so honored to be a part of this plan of reconstruction.

Two weeks later, Troy returned with another semi-truck full of sheetrock supplies, 10 totes full of dolls and monkeys for our younger children, supplies requested by some of our teachers who experienced the worst losses, new appliances for the school's uninsured rental house, and 13 large containers full of startup supplies for each of our worker families who had lost many of their possessions. The container held things like a crock pot, coffee pot, pots and pans, kitchen supplies, can opener, etc., that were so needed in the rebuilding process for our workers.



When I had first heard that water was rushing in our buildings due to the heavy rains and a swollen creek near the LSA campus on August 27, I asked God to guide and direct our community in the process of what to do next. His response has been beyond anything I could have imagined. A true Ephesians 3:20-21 experience: "Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen." Our God is faithful and nothing is too hard for Him. He used the people of Iowa District West to bless many people in Houston. He used people throughout the world to offer their love and prayers and support in helping LSA rebuild. By God's grace and mercy, the LSA students and faculty were back in their nearly completed buildings on Monday, October 16.

Thank you to the men and women of Iowa District West, and especially our newest friend, Ellie Menz! May God continue to use you to shine His love on those who are hurting in His world.






