"Dose of Wisdom"

Can you believe it? It's that time again. We are gearing up here for Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent. Time seems to move faster and faster each year. This year for the season of Lent we are looking at "Returning from Exile". This is what we are looking at this Lenten season.



Once again we prepare to enter into the Lenten season as we journey through the Church Year. Lent, however, is its own kind of journey. Lent is the journey we make as we travel with Christ from the Mount of Transfiguration to Jerusalem where He will face the cross and the grave for our sakes. It is a very sobering trip, a journey that often struggles to find joy. But there is Easter!

This year our theme for our Lenten worship will focus upon the journey, but perhaps not in the way we usually walk it. Our overall theme will be "Return from Exile: A Lenten Journey." All journeys must have a starting point; and in the preaching and teaching this Lenten season, we will consider our starting point a land of exile.

The land of exile from which we begin our journey is the wilderness of sin and death. Sin came into the world when our first parents were unfaithful and disobedient, eating fruit from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Adam and Eve sinned, and we have inherited from them not only the sin itself, but also the result of that sin—separation from our Lord and God. From the first sin in the first garden, we have been exiled into the wilderness where we have wandered without any ability to find our way out.

This is the beginning of our journey: exile. But every journey also has a destination, an ending point. Our return from exile brings us into the promised land. Our relationship with our God is restored by Christ's sacrifice. Our destination, then, is the perfect place, the new garden, the courts of heaven—the ultimate destination which was established for us by His death and resurrection. There is great joy in the journey as we see where our returning brings us; but there is also a somber attitude when we consider what Christ faced on account of our sin.

All journeys consist of many events that take place between the journey's beginning and its end. Our Lenten journey is no different. Each leg of our Lenten journey begins in the Old Testament and then continues into the New Testament, pointing us to the joy that is ours in

Christ Jesus. Do not be surprised to discover that from the very beginning, even outside the gates of the Garden of Eden, it is Christ who travels with us. He has always been our guide, from the very beginning, and He will journey with us to the very end. Indeed, He has even gone before us to prepare a heavenly dwelling place.

Life is full of journeys. Life itself is a journey. We enter this Lenten season contemplating the reality of our earthly journey but with eyes fixed on its destination—the empty tomb and the open gates of everlasting life. What joy there is in knowing that we do not walk this way alone!



Mealtime as a family

Amid busy and varied schedules, many families find a way to sit down together for dinner regularly. Family-health advocates describe the benefits: an increased sense of unity, children sharing news and feeling listened to, and the physical perks of a planned, seated meal.

In Scripture, many great encounters between people and God happen around meals. Abraham and Sarah prepare a meal for three guests who turn out to be angels (Genesis 18). God instructs the Hebrew slaves to eat a special meal together before their delivery from Egypt (Exodus 12); every year since, Jews have celebrated the Passover feast. Elijah is strengthened with food served by an angel (1 Kings 19). Jesus shares meals not only with religious leaders but with "sinners" (e.g., Matthew 9). Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples before his death has become one of the church's sacraments and a "foretaste" of the heavenly banquet to come.

When Christian families eat together, it's a holy time in God's presence, just as when the church shares Holy Communion — a true fellowship dinner!

And thus subdue our hastiness and angry tempers,



The Love of JESUS

Three coins in a fountain! I can hear those words in my head from a song long ago. It simply came to mind as I was beginning this article with three photos on a page. Are you wondering about these three unrelated photos? How could people covered with beautiful quilts, a group of blue sweat-shirted people against the Los Angeles skyline, and the Lutheran Hour float in the Rose Parade on January 1 have any connection? Surely they must have a common thread to be featured in this article.

Petal Pushers in Pasadena at the famous Rose Parade know the answer. Twenty-nine people, most from the western half of Iowa, traveled to sunny California to decorate the only Christian float in the parade. As IOWAY Director, I led the trip for the 15th time. The group worked two eight-hour shifts decorating floats.



The first shift started in the flower area where thousands of vellow roses were put into vials. Later, the work shifted to decorating floats in a huge building that was a few miles from Pasadena. The second shift, on day two, found nearly half of the group excitedly working on the Lutheran Hour Float. They attached much of the greenery and most of the roses onto the sides of the beautiful float! The float was a witness to millions of people, showing the love of Jesus along Colorado Boulevard and on TV on New Year's Day.

The next day, the group worked at the Union Rescue Mission in downtown Los Angeles, showing the love of Jesus to the homeless on Skid Row. They shared approximately 1,000 health kits and thousands of dollars of other supplies donated by people from Iowa. This action demonstrated the love of Jesus to those struggling in Los Angeles. The homeless very much appreciated this outpouring of love. The group gathered on the roof of the building for a photo against the Los Angeles skyline as the day



ended. The love of Jesus had affected the group members as much as it had the homeless.

That evening, Kimberley, a teacher in one of the poorest districts in the Los Angeles school system, came to share about the life of her classroom children. On a trip a few years ago, Karen from Lone Rock, Iowa, was moved to show the love of Jesus to Kimberley's kids. Karen loves to make quilts so she began making quilt tops. LWML ladies across Iowa District West volunteered to tie them. This year's team brought 38 of those guilts to California. It was the love of Jesus that motivated Karen to make them, motivated the ladies to tie them, and overwhelmed Kimberley as the team covered her with evidence of that love by spreading the quilts over her.



She passes on the love of Jesus to each of her students as they receive a quilt. Those quilts bring the love of Jesus down into the laps and lives of those sixth graders. It is a special gift they will never forget for it is totally unique, something in their lives they never dreamed of. Jesus is like that, His love is beyond what we can dream or imagine.

Three photos on a page! Yes, they do fit together. All three were composed and lighted by the love of Jesus in the lives of His people. Thanks be to God!
