This took some courage to stand in front of the live audience as well as those on TV watching worldwide. Now he didn't come out and specifically speak the name of Jesus, but this was a good speech nonetheless witnessing the forgiveness of sins and Jesus who shed his blood for this forgiveness.

During this month of July think of the freedoms we have in this country. Think of the sacrifices made for this freedom we enjoy. Know that as Christ shed his blood for the freedom we have in Him, so also think of those brave young men and women who gave their lives so we can have the freedom to worship and speak Christ to others in the world we live in today. 
July 15, 2018





In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. Special services like Advent, Lent, Christmas, etc are **NOT** automatically deducted and we would encourage you to use your offering envelopes for those services just like in the past. For each person our Financial Secretary has to handle 52 envelopes and bookkeeping entries per year, and when you multiply that by approximately 275 envelope numbers, that is a significant amount of work that could be avoided by using the Simply Giving Program. An additional bonus would be that our giving throughout the year would be more consistent. We prayerfully ask that you consider making this small change that would be of big help. We will be sending books to kids. Sharing God's Mighty Word is an outreach project that sends Bible based story books to kids around the US. The project focuses on reaching inner city kids, Hispanic kids, Native American kids and kids in crisis.

By getting our students involved in this project, we are teaching them and the kids they help serve that God values all people regardless of race, ethnicity, or social status We are teaching that God reaches out especially to those who are suffering, that He doesn't forget them, that He loves them. And we are teaching that they can be missionaries in their own communities.

Deb Owen assisted with the secretarial needs and newly confirmed teens, other church members and their friends assisted in all areas of need. Scott Linde and Allan Kock made the woodworking projects.

The ladies prepare all the materials for the quilts and the students tie them using the two frames that keep all the helpers hopping. It is truly appreciated how everyone comes forth each year for the week of Vacation Bible School. Thanks again to Lila Thiedeman for the fresh bread on Tuesday and Curtis Ehlers for the donuts on Wednesday. Parents assisted with Rice Krispie Bars and cookies for Thursday through Saturday. It is a fun week and hopefully, memories are created that will last a lifetime.

Sioux City- IOWAY Coordinators enjoyed packing 6,456 meals for the hungry at Faith Lutheran Church in Sioux City. It is a great opportunity for you, your family or your church group to help others. Mercy Meals of Siouxland, began packaging fortified rice soy meals (Mercy Meals) for hungry and starving children in the U.S. and worldwide on June 23, 2012. Meals are packaged utilizing community volunteers ages eight and up in an assembly line process. Meals consist of rice, soy, dried vegetables and a vitamin/mineral base powder put into plastic bags containing six meals per bag. Each bag of six meals costs 72 cents to package. All meals are donated to Orphan Grain Train whose headquarters are in Norfolk, Nebraska and they ship the meals to destinations of their choosing at their cost. Meals are delivered at the point of destination by a Christian organization so the children hear about Jesus as well as receiving food. The ministry has packaged and donated 1,485,515 Mercy Meals since June 23, 2012. The ministry is sustained through the generosity of donors who pay for the materials and supplies used to package meals. 




