It is something that if they see you modeling the growing in faith and learning *AS ADULTS* they too will want to learn their whole lives long. 


The AWV Staff is hosting a Staley's Chicken Supper on Wednesday—September 12, 2018 serving from 5-8 at the Westside Community Building - -








## **ADULT BIBLE CLASS**


## ATTENTION HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ---

In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. Special services like Advent, Lent, Christmas, etc are NOT automatically deducted and we would encourage you to use your offering envelopes for those services just like in the past. For each person our Financial Secretary has to handle 52 envelopes and bookkeeping entries per year, and when you multiply that by approximately 275 envelope numbers, that is a significant amount of work that could be avoided by using the Simply Giving Program. An additional bonus would be that our giving throughout the year would be more consistent. We prayerfully ask that you consider making this small change that would be of big help. ## FROM A FAMILY WHO USES THE "SIMPLY GIVING PROGRAM"

"Simply Giving" is simply easy! If you are hesitant about starting the "Simply Giving" program...don't be! Just decide how much you normally give to church each week (or month) and have it transferred from your banking account to the **church's** account. It is shown on your bank statement and you decide when you want to give each month. It frees your mind as you go to church in that you have given your share and don't have to write a check or look for money each time you go to church. You are REALLY putting the **Lord's** work first. You will still have the envelopes and can give more throughout the year. If you are gone the church still receives your contribution. Give it some thought. The more who participate gives the church board the financial support in a more orderly fashion as they will know how much to anticipate each month.

## L.I.F.E. - Living in Faith Everyday

How do we live in faith every day? Living In Faith Everyday means we keep our eyes on Jesus, the author and preserver of our faith. It means knowing our Savior, Jesus Christ and what He has done for us. the workplace, to neighbors, and those we meet in He is perfect. We are not!

Thankfully, we have a Savior who forgives us for all our sins. He gives us physical life, an abundant life, and eternal life as gifts. We recognize that the forgiveness that Christ offers us didn't come easily, lesus Christ, we will go to live with Him forever. suffered and died for our sins. Soldiers spit on Him, mocked Him, beat Him, and stripped Him of His clothes. His disciples and friends deserted Him. Peter denied Him three times. Even His Father turned away as Jesus cried from the cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mark 15:34) Jesus suffered in our place. His blood covers ours sins. He died. His body was placed in the tomb. It was sealed and guarded. Thankfully, three days later, as He had promised, He rose from the dead. He showed His glorified risen body to the disciples, the women, and to 500 believers at once during the 40 days He remained on earth after His resurrection. Because He rose from the dead, we can be confident that we will also rise and live with Him forever.

Living In Faith Everyday means we understand that we are saved by faith alone (Ephesians 2:8-9), not by our works. Is it helping those who have lost their home in a tornado? Is it sharing God's Word with someone who doesn't know the Lord? Is it offering encouragement and help to those who are Christians, but struggle with drugs, alcohol, pornography, or a myriad of other issues of life? Whatever God has called you to do, do it with joy.

Living In Faith Everyday means we attend worship services, partake of communion, study God's Word,

and pray. We grow spiritually and learn to discern truth from error. With God's help, we grow into the person God wants us to be.

Living In Faith Everyday means learning to say, "I'm sorry, will you forgive me" to the Lord, and to our family and friends. We also learn to say "I'm sorry" in the community

## **Working Together to Serve Others**

It is such a joy to see God's people working together to serve others. Each person's donation of money or items adds together to make a huge difference in supplying basic needs for others.

This story began with LWML members getting involved, collecting thousands of items and bringing them to the LWML Convention at Camp Okoboji. Two stuffed vehicles brought the items to Jefferson.

The pile of items were added to donations that were brought to the District office in Fort Dodge. On August

7, the cavalry of sorters, counters and packers arrived at Trinity Lutheran in Jefferson. The cavalry, aka the "fabulous folks from Farnhamville"



and Dale Schmidt from Carroll, spent several hours flexing their muscles organizing and dividing the thousands of items. The items were then designated for various mission outreaches. My Farnhamville friends also added hundreds of knit hats and over 40 quilts. Dale's vehicle and my van



were FULLY packed!

On August 10, our two vehicles met three more vehicles that were FULLY packed for the homeless and those in need.

Meeting at the hotel in Council Bluffs was the beginning of the 2018 IOWAY Mission Trip to Omaha/Council Bluffs. Our IOWAY team of 18 served at four outreaches: MOHM'S Place, Takin' It To The Streets, Heartland Hope, and Open Door Missions. On Friday, we served the evening meal at MOHM's

Place (Messengers of Hope Ministry) which is a homeless shelter housing 120 men. It is interesting to visit with the men. We met a man who was a bank examiner. His life went downhill after a stroke. Recently, he was paying \$325/month for rent and it was raised to \$800/month. He is now homeless.

Later, we met with Jerry Hetrick who shared his vision and goals to reach the underprivileged and homeless in the Council Bluffs area through Takin' It To The Streets. Some of you remember Bobby Dofner who worked with this ministry. He has retired and the previously rented location was sold and now a high rise is being built there. Jerry Hetrick is a part-time pastor who loves to cook and has a true heart for the homeless.



On Saturday morning, we

worked at Heartland Hope for four hours helping to distribute food and clothing to the families who came to the center. The focus at Heartland Hope is unique. It is to keep people in their homes by having them use the income they have to pay for rent. Heartland Hope helps provide the families with food, clothing and other needs. To receive food and clothing, a family has to meet certain income requirements and they can come to the center once a month for clothing and a large grocery cart of food. The amount they receive is based on the number of family members. We learned that Heartland Hope serves over 1,400 families each month.

We had a quick lunch in the parking lot and then headed to Open Door Mission where we sorted clothes and stocked shelves.

At Open Door, a family can come once a month and shop for half an hour for items their family needs like clothes, books, kitchen items, etc.



Thanks to the generosity of many individuals and churches, we delivered nearly 800 items to each of the four outreaches. At Heartland Hope, we delivered 416 pounds of clothes, 607 hygiene items and 11.5 pounds of food.

Each evening we met for devotions and shared ways that we can continue our outreach after returning to our own communities. On Sunday, after attending church as a group at Faith Lutheran Church in Council Bluffs, we enjoyed a meal and then headed home to continue serving our great God.

There are many ways to involve all ages in collecting items and in serving the homeless. Remember, no one's goal in life is to be homeless. Many people need a "hand up." As we



learn in 1 John 3:17-18: If a person sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against his brother, how can he claim that he loves God? My children, our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action.
