it seemed good to me also, having followed all things closely for some time past, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, that you may have certainty concerning the things you have been taught.

Confirmation was celebrated on Palm Sunday. Nine catechumens were confirmed and received Holy Communion for the first time. It is a tradition that has been celebrated and remembered for many years both here at Zion as well as many other churches. It is something that culminates 4 years of catechesis (the same word used in Luke 1:4, see above.) The one misconception many people have about Confirmation is that it is very similar to graduation. I learned all I need to know in catechesis, or I learned all I need to know in high school. Now if you have graduated from high school and you are reading this did you really know everything there was to know in life? I remember my high school days and I must say I know more now than I did in high school for sure. So if we have learned much more since high school how much more should this be for our faith. The goal of catechesis is faith in Christ, meaning it is of the utmost importance we learn of our sins and there is nothing we can do to earn our salvation. Faith in Christ is strengthened when we listen to preaching, confess our sins, receive absolution, and receive the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Our Confirmation might be DONE, but our CATECHESIS continues for our entire lifetime. I encourage you to listen to the readings for the season of Easter especially from the First Reading and the Gospel Reading. We will be focusing on the Book of Acts during this Easter Season. The entire Book of Acts is focused on the teachings of Jesus and the spreading of those teachings so others may be converted from their sins to faith in Christ. I would also encourage you to continue to learn and grow in faith in Christ by reading your Bible and Luther's Small Catechism. In fact if you are looking for a new Small Catechism, then Concordia Publishing House is your place as they have both Luther's Small and Large Catechism bound together in one book. Come and see me for details or go to cph.org. We have treasures in our faith in the Scriptures and Luther's Small Catechism. Let us use those treasures so our faith in Christ may grow.





Congratulations to the young members of our congregation who are graduating! No doubt they look forward to the next phase of their lives with excitement, anticipation and perhaps a little apprehension.


We hope these words, adapted from Phillips Brooks, will serve graduates well as they embark on their journeys:







The two high priority projects are outdoor painting and wood splitting.


