### PDOSE OF WISCOM

### Matthew 9:35-36


We celebrate the kids coming to Sunday school, but we also want to focus on teaching in the adult section of our church as well. For many years, Zion has always had strong youth and children ministries with VBS, Sunday School, Midweek classes, and many other opportunities. But one thing that has lacked is attendance in Adult Bible Class on Sunday morning. We are averaging about 8-10 participants now, and we can grow that even more, there is always room for one more. Look at this text from Matthew 9 the crowds were NOT all children, they were adults and maybe a few children with them. Jesus spent time teaching the adults who came to Him. We have a great adult Bible class available for those who desire to learn with Jesus and from Jesus. Come and join us as we look together at God's Word at 9:00 then stay for Divine Service at 10:00.

Once again the curriculum we use this year will follow what the youth use in Sunday school. So what we discuss in Sunday school (both youth & adults) will be covered. This alignment presents some amazing opportunities.

- First of all, it helps all ages speak a **common theological language**.
- Second, it helps God's people build an understanding of the **lifelong nature of learning God's Word**—that we don't just learn the narratives once or twice before moving on to other matters.
- Third, and critical to this curriculum, it helps equip households to teach the faith in the home.

So I cannot stress how important it is to attend Bible class on Sunday mornings. If we desire this faith to continue for generations we need to be in the Word and talk about this faith with our families. Come and share this time with us on Sunday mornings.




### **ADULT BIBLE CLASS**





Thank you for your help with our "School Kit" Mission Project.



This reminder goes out endlessly, but sewing circle is **ALWAYS** in need of sheets, lightweight blankets, and **NEW** material for making quilt tops, middles and backs. A small group of ladies are the core of this worthwhile project. Quilt tops/backs are made at home and the quilts are tied at church. The large pieces of material (especially sheets) speed up the job!

The Sewing Circle meets on the 3rd Monday of every month. Help is always needed .



In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. Special services like Advent, Lent, Christmas, etc are NOT automatically deducted and we would encourage you to use your offering envelopes for those services just like in the past. For each person our Financial Secretary has to handle 52 envelopes and bookkeeping entries per year, and when you multiply that by approximately 275 envelope numbers, that is a significant amount of work that could be avoided by using the Simply Giving Program. An additional bonus would be that our giving throughout the year would be more consistent. We prayerfully ask that you consider making this small change that would be of big help. ### FROM A FAMILY WHO USES THE "SIMPLY GIVING PROGRAM"

"Simply Giving" is simply easy! If you are hesitant about starting the "Simply Giving" program...don't be! Just decide how much you normally give to church each week (or month) and have it transferred from your banking account to the church's account. It is shown on your bank statement and you decide when you want to give each month. It frees your mind as you go to church in that you have given your share and don't have to write a check or look for money each time you go to church. You are REALLY putting the Lord's work first. You will still have the envelopes and can give more throughout the year. If you are gone the church still receives your contribution. Give it some thought. The more who participate gives the church board the financial support in a more orderly fashion as they will know how much to anticipate each month.

### **ENDOWMENT PROJECT SUGGESTIONS**


Once again the council is asking the congregation for suggestions on how to spend the money made available from the endowment fund. The endowment fund was started approximately 30 years ago when the Mildred Kasperson estate gave Zion approximately \$100,000 in cash and 160 acres of farmland. At that time it was decided to only spend the interest generated from that cash, and the farm rental income, and to never invade the principle of those funds. The spending of those funds is not to be used for normal budgeted items. Over the years this has been a wonderful blessing to our congregation and the council wants all our members to know that anyone may donate to the endowment fund and any time. This year we will have approximately \$40,000 to spend from the endowment fund. Your input in welcomed and encouraged!

### L.I.F.E. - Living in Faith Everyday

How do we live in faith every day? Living In Faith Everyday means we keep our eyes on lesus, the author and preserver of our faith. It means knowing our Savior, Jesus Christ and what He has done for us. the workplace, to neighbors, and those we meet in He is perfect. We are not!

Thankfully, we have a Savior who forgives us for all our sins. He gives us physical life, an abundant life, and eternal life as gifts. We recognize that the forgiveness that Christ offers us didn't come easily. Jesus Christ, we will go to live with Him forever. suffered and died for our sins. Soldiers spit on Him, mocked Him, beat Him, and stripped Him of His clothes. His disciples and friends deserted Him. Peter denied Him three times. Even His Father turned away as lesus cried from the cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mark 15:34) Jesus suffered in our place. His blood covers ours sins. He died. His body was placed in the tomb. It was sealed and guarded. Thankfully, three days later, as He had promised, He rose from the dead. He showed His glorified risen body to the disciples, the women, and to 500 believers at once during the 40 days He remained on earth after His resurrection. Because He rose from the dead, we can be confident that we will also rise and live with Him forever.

Living In Faith Everyday means we understand that we are saved by faith alone (Ephesians 2:8-9), not by our works. But, we also understand that Ephesians 2:10 tells us that God has prepared works for us to do in advance. What work God has prepared for you? Is it helping a woman who is pregnant and alone? Is it ministering to someone who has had an abortion and can't believe that God would forgive her? Is it feeding the hungry? Is it ministering to the sick? Is it helping those who have lost their home in a tornado? Is it sharing God's Word with someone who doesn't know the Lord? Is it offering encouragement and help to those who are Christians, but struggle with drugs, alcohol, pornography, or a myriad of other issues of life? Whatever God has called you to do, do it with joy.

Living In Faith Everyday means we attend worship services, partake of communion, study God's Word, and pray. We grow spiritually and learn to discern truth from error. With God's help, we grow into the person God wants us to be.


