Why Every Sunday Communion

"Pastor, if the Lord's Supper is everything that the Bible and catechism say it is, then why don't we have the opportunity to receive it when we come for worship each week."

Quote from 'The Blessings of Weekly Communion', Rev. Wieting, CPH, 2006

Every Sunday Holy Communion is the historic tradition of the Church from the beginning, and the tradition of Lutheran doctrine and practice. It is because of this historic tradition that we decided to offer it every Sunday when Gov. Kim Reynolds allowed churches to worship with more than 10 members present. This was May 3rd, that we allowed and practiced Every Sunday Communion. I believe in this time where we have been isolated and away from one another, holy communion is *exactly* what we need to help with strengthening our faith.

The center of the Church's life is the Eucharist. The center of each Christian's life is the Lord's Supper (Eucharist). The Confessions of the Lutheran Church are explicitly and implicitly Eucharistic. The Divine Service was and is understood to be THE ordinary worship of the Church on Sunday. The Eucharist, however, was moved to the side during centuries of assault from rationalism, pietism, and too many other "isms" inflicted upon the Church and born from within her. What was once ordinary (in the sense or normal) became extraordinary (in the sense of exceptional) in the life of Lutheran congregations and Lutheran Christians in those congregations. The Eucharist, so long an addendum onto the Divine Service, is intrinsic to the Divine Service -- not only on Sunday morning but in the hearts and lives of the people in the pews. The Church from day 1 celebrated the Lord's Supper every Sunday. Christ places the Sacraments central to His Gospel and who we are as His people. Our Lutheran Confessions are written from and to this perspective. Our hymnals are wonderful resources to direct us again to the Divine Service, where in Word and Sacrament fulfills the promise of the Christ.

What if you think, "I do not feel the need to communion that often." Our feelings are unreliable gauges of spiritual need. In the catechism, "Christian Questions with Their Answers," Luther reminds us to commune first because of *Christ's command and promise*. And, he continues, though we may not feel any need, we should still believe the Scriptures which declare our need. Moreover, though I may not desire to commune on a particular day, there may be others who very much need and want the strengthening power of the Sacrament. Should my lack of perceived need, determine the need of my brother or sister? Christian charity offers a clear answer.

On a typical Sunday, the pews are filled with people who would commune that day if they could. Often that person may be you or:

The person mourning the death of a loved one.

The person who after a long separation from God comes to church.

The child of a divorced family who can commune only with the parent attending that day.

The person diagnosed with cancer, disease, or another serious illness.

The teen or adult whose work schedule prevents them from worshipping most Sundays.

The person who struggles with their family issues Saturday night and needs to be reminded the most precious gift was and still is free.

The abused person.

The unemployed person.

The person who is dying and desires this seal of resurrection. The person struggling, fighting with guilt and temptation The person who hungers for the sacrament.

"In our churches Mass is celebrated every Sunday and on other festivals, when the sacrament is offered to those who wish for it after they have been examined and absolved." (Article XXIV--Augsburg Confession-Lutheran Confessional Writings see Zion Lutheran Church's Constitution Article 2. ②). We see that the Lutheran Reformers continued to celebrate Holy Communion every Sunday, restoring and teaching its meaning, and inviting their people to commune more and more. Wrote John Gerhard, one of Lutheranism's great theologians:

Because therefore it has been accepted as a practice in the Christian Church that in the public assemblies of the Church after the preaching and hearing of the Word, this Sacrament is celebrated, therefore this custom must not be departed from without urgent necessity . . . it is . . . clear from Acts 20:7, 1 Cor. 11:20, 33, that when the Christians did gather at one place, they were accustomed to celebrate the Eucharist (Quatuor Evangelistarum/ Frankfurt and Hamburg, 1652 Vol. II, p. 1085).12

Come and receive the sacrament this beautiful gift from Jesus often.







ENDOWMENT PROJECT SUGGESTIONS

Once again the council is asking the congregation for suggestions on how to spend the money made available from the endowment fund. The endowment fund was started approximately 30 years ago when the Mildred Kasperson estate gave Zion approximately \$100,000 in cash and 160 acres of farmland. At that time it was decided to only spend the interest generated from that cash, and the farm rental income, and to never invade the principle of those funds. The spending of those funds is not to be used for normal budgeted items. Over the years this has been a wonderful blessing to our congregation and the council wants all our members to know that anyone may donate to the endowment fund and any time. This year we will have approximately \$50,000 to spend from the endowment fund. Your input in welcomed and encouraged!

In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. Special services like Advent, Lent, Christmas, etc are NOT automatically deducted and we would encourage you to use your offering envelopes for those services just like in the past. For each person our Financial Secretary has to handle 52 envelopes and bookkeeping entries per year, and when you multiply that by approximately 275 envelope numbers, that is a significant amount of work that could be avoided by using the Simply Giving Program. An additional bonus would be that our giving throughout the year would be more consistent. We prayerfully ask that you consider making this small change that would be of big help. "Simply Giving" is simply easy! If you are hesitant about starting the "Simply Giving" program...don't bel Just decide how much you normally give to church each week (or month) and have it transferred from your banking account to the church's account. It is shown on your bank statement and you decide when you want to give each month. It frees your mind as you go to church in that you have given your share and don't have to write a check or look for money each time you go to church. You are REALLY putting the Lord's work first. You will still have the envelopes and can give more throughout the year. If you are gone the church still receives your contribution. Give it some thought. The more who participate gives the church board the financial support in a more orderly fashion as they will know how much to anticipate each month.



L.I.F.E. - Living in Faith Everyday

How do we live in faith every day? Living In Faith Everyday means we keep our eyes on Jesus, the author and preserver of our faith. It means knowing our Savior, Jesus Christ and what He has done for us. the workplace, to neighbors, and those we meet in He is perfect. We are not!

Thankfully, we have a Savior who forgives us for all our sins. He gives us physical life, an abundant life, and eternal life as gifts. We recognize that the forgiveness that Christ offers us didn't come easily. Jesus suffered and died for our sins. Soldiers spit on Him, mocked Him, beat Him, and stripped Him of His clothes. His disciples and friends deserted Him. Peter denied Him three times. Even His Father turned away as Jesus cried from the cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mark 15:34) Jesus suffered in our place. His blood covers ours sins. He died. His body was placed in the tomb. It was sealed and guarded. Thankfully, three days later, as He had promised, He rose from the dead. He showed His glorified risen body to the disciples, the women, and to 500 believers at once during the 40 days He remained on earth after His resurrection. Because He rose from the dead, we can be confident that we will also rise and live with Him forever.

Living In Faith Everyday means we understand that we are saved by faith alone (Ephesians 2:8-9), not by our works. But, we also understand that Ephesians 2:10 tells us that God has prepared works for us to do in advance. What work God has prepared for you? Is it helping a woman who is pregnant and alone? Is it ministering to someone who has had an abortion and can't believe that God would forgive her? Is it feeding the hungry? Is it ministering to the sick? Is it helping those who have lost their home in a tornado? Is it sharing God's Word with someone who doesn't know the Lord? Is it offering encouragement and help to those who are Christians, but struggle with drugs, alcohol, pornography, or a myriad of other issues of life? Whatever God has called you to do, do it with joy.

Living In Faith Everyday means we attend worship services, partake of communion, study God's Word, and pray. We grow spiritually and learn to discern truth from error. With God's help, we grow into the person God wants us to be.




