# DOSE OF WISDOM

## 2 Timothy 4:13

When you come, bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas, also the books, and above all the parchments.

There are many different things we pastors wear while serving. One of those garments we can wear is something called a chasuble. It comes from the Bible Verse cited above, Paul is asking Timothy if he can bring Paul his cloak, *casula* which meant “little hut” because it covered the whole man. As the *casula* passed out of secular usage, it was retained as a clerical vestment and became known as a chasuble. This cloak is what I want to write about today.

In many congregations where there is an emphasis on liturgy and the sacrament of Holy Communion the chasuble is used quite frequently. Pastor Noble used one and wore it on Confirmation Sunday as is seen in many pictures we have from those days he served here.

I too would like to look into wearing one for Divine Services. There is nothing in the scriptures that says we have to use one, but it will confess what we believe regarding the Lord’s Supper. The Lord’s Supper is something that we celebrate as it is Christ’s body and blood coming to us in the bread and wine. We believe it comes to us so we can have the forgiveness of sins. If this sacrament is all that we say it is then it is something we can celebrate and dress up for. That includes the pastor!

The chasuble is beautifully decorated in the liturgical color of the season. Often on the front and back it has bands called an orphery that form a cross. The chasuble is part of the ceremony of the liturgy. This ceremony – the movements by the pastor, the way the communion ware is handled, the vestments, paraments, candles, etc. – is part of the Church’s catholic (universal) culture. The chasuble visually signifies that like the Lutherans of the Reformation we embrace the catholic faith and the practice that flows from it.

Recently a change for the better has appeared. In the Missouri Synod, particularly, growing numbers of the clergy and the laity have realized that if we return, as we have done, to the sixteenth century for our standards of doctrine, it is inconsistent not to do the same for standards of practice and ceremonial. And so, throughout our Synod, one parish after another is reintroducing some feature that the Church had ignobly forgotten. Today it is a significant commentary upon the appeal of these vestments that there is not a single instance on record where they have been abolished after being restored.

So in the next few months if you see me in a chasuble during the Divine Service know that is something we want to restore to emphasize the importance and holiness of the sacrament of The Lord’s Supper.

In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. ## Hurricane in Iowa?

Derecho! What exactly is that? Few people had heard of a hurricane on land before August 10. The sirens sounded and my husband and I headed for the basement. After the strong winds moved east, we found an 80-foot tree had landed on our roof and three large trees landed on our driveway. It was soon obvious that clearing the driveway was too large a project for our tractor and chainsaw.



Our neighbor came to the rescue with a larger tractor and was able to clear the driveway. That was followed by my phone calls to a local tree service, insurance agent and a contractor. Now a long wait for the roof repair! That was our experience and the story was repeated many times across Iowa and Illinois.

As we were coming out of our basement, family and friends in the Cedar Rapids area were in their basements. The storm traveled fast and furiously leaving disaster and destruction in its path! It ripped out many thousands of trees and utility poles.

A huge thank you to the linemen. They are amazing unsung heroes! Our world does not function well without electricity! We were out of power for only eight hours, but I know a pastor in Cedar Rapids whose church and home were without power for twelve days.

As the Disaster Response Coordinator for Iowa District West, my first step was to contact pastors in the affected areas. Then it was like a huge puzzle of putting the pieces together of who needs help and who is willing to help. I am so blessed to know people who are willing to put to work their muscles, chain saws and skid loaders.

To begin the process of helping, the Boone Circuit LERT trailer was relocated to Trinity Lutheran Church in Des Moines. Angela Weiss headed a team of volunteers who worked for two days to clean up debris in Des Moines. One day with five volunteers and the next day with seven.



Our LERT team of 25 and another team of 18 worked at two different farm homes in the Woodward area. These great teams included volunteers from nine IDW Lutheran churches. A team of four led by Pastor Roger Carlisle, Peace Lutheran Church, Wall Lake, worked in the Marshalltown area.

Another amazing LERT team from IDW worked for two days at a home in Cedar Rapids to cut up and clear downed trees. Pastor Dave Simonson, Immanuel, Spirit Lake led a team to State Center and Clemons where their help was greatly appreciated by two families.



Each of these seven teams worked to cut up and move a mountain of logs and branches. At the end of the day, there were friendships made, huge piles of debris moved and many sore muscles. We left feeling good about being able to help and the homeowners were overjoyed that people would work all day helping strangers.

Along with helping strangers, neighbors and family helped neighbors and family! That is what God wants us to do and that is what we Iowans did and will continue to do. God's people from other states are also reaching out to help with the disaster. I have received calls from North Carolina, Nebraska, North Dakota, Texas, Missouri, Indiana and Wisconsin.

God's blessings to all who donated financially and with physical labor to help those in need.

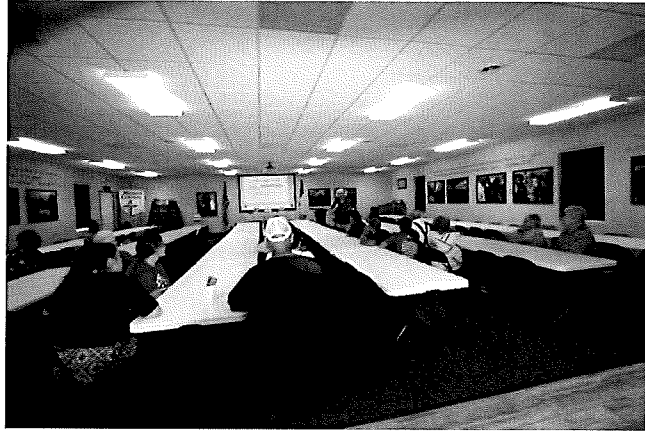

#### Use a Charitable trust to transfer your IRA or 401K to your children



Do you have an IRA or 401k plan? What is your plan to pass these assets on to your children? Yes, your spouse can receive these assets from you tax free when you die but not your children.

Most children take their parents IRA or 401k assets out in a lump sum and pay the state and federal income taxes. There is a better way. You can name a charitable trust with the LCMS Foundation as the beneficiary at your death if you are single or at the second death if you are married. These assets are then transferred to your charitable trust tax free. The LCMS Foundation will then make payments to your children for 20 years. At the end of the 20 years of payments, the principal of your charitable trust is distributed by the LCMS Foundation to your favorite LCMS ministries according to your direction.

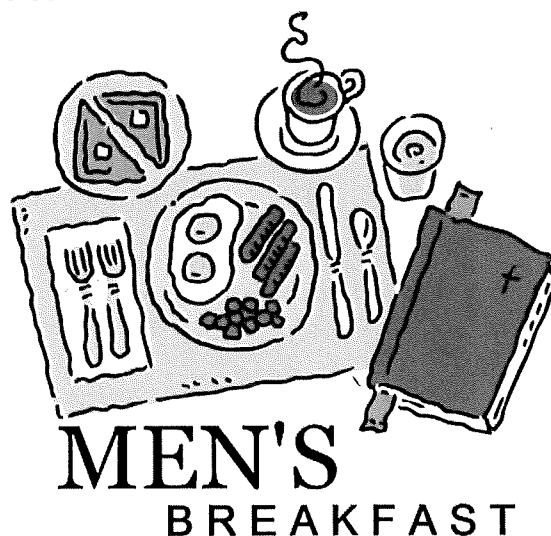


