"Ah, dear Christians, let us not value or treat this unspeakable gift so halfheartedly. For baptism is our only comfort and the doorway to all of God's possessions and to the communion of all the saints. To this end may God help us" writes Luther in his baptismal booklet appended to the second edition of the Small Catechism in 1529. By including his Taufbuechein of 1526 in the catechism, Luther accented not only the liturgical significance of baptism but also the value of this sacrament for the Christian life. Luther identifies baptism as the believer's "only comfort." It is this theme that will be examined in representative pastoral pieces in Luther's writings after the publication of the catechisms. The language of the catechisms on baptism shaped Luther's use of baptism for the consolation of Christians.


Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed. It feels weird writing this on Tuesday of Holy Week. But even though we must go through Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, we know Easter Sunday happens. So we can say anytime those words that give us comfort and hope. They give us comfort because in these words of resurrection, they remind us of our baptism! Baptism and Easter go hand in hand. They remind us of the eternal life Jesus won for us as He rose from the dead. Those benefits Jesus won for us are shared with us through Baptism, the Lord's Supper, and the Word of God, these three things are what we call the Means of Grace. They are the vehicles God uses to give His gifts to His children by faith.

Luther once comforted his mother who was gravely ill with the words of comfort, "you know the real basis and foundation of your salvation, on which you must rest your confidence in this and all troubles, namely Jesus Christ, the cornerstone, who will never waver or fail us, nor allow us to sink and perish, for he is the Saviour and he is called the Saviour of all poor sinners, of all who face tribulation and death, of all who rely on him and call on his name." And again he comforted John Ruehl, chancellor to Count Albert of Mansfeld and a relative of Luther by marriage who was ill with the promises of baptism, "The realization that you have been called by this Man, that you have been blessed by a knowledge, desire, and love for his Word, and that you have been sealed therein by his Baptism and Sacrament should surely make you more cheerful...Dear doctor, behold the good things you possess at his hands rather than what you suffer." Luther wanted to comfort people with assurances of Holy Baptism. I think we miss that today. Even though we all hold baptism near and dear to us, do we use it in our everyday lives like Luther pointed out to his mother and the chancellor. It is something we can continue to comfort us and help us each day of our lives.

We have these great words from Luther when the devil attacks us, Therefore, for Luther, urges those who are troubled by satanic assaults on faith to rely on baptism. Baptism is to be used as weaponry against Satan as he attacks the conscience: "Thus, we must regard baptism and put it to use in such a way that we may draw strength and comfort from it when our sins or conscience oppress us and say: 'But I am baptized! And if I have been baptized, I have the promise that I shall be saved and have eternal life, both in body and soul."24 And again "Thus we see what a great and excellent thing baptism is, which snatches us from the jaws of the devil and makes us God's own, overcomes and takes away sin and daily strengthens the new person, and always endures and remains until we pass out of this misery into eternal glory."

So this season of Easter be comforted with words and promises of Christ in Holy Baptism! Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

Now, God is calling these dear folks to their "fatherland." It was a blessing to pray for them and send the off to their calling! The Tiews family is pictured with the NOT NORMAL people who came to pray for them. It was a day we will long remember!

AMAZING "NOT NORMAL" PEOPLE FROM ST. PAUL LUTHERAN IN CARROLL, IOWA VISIT MISSION CENTRAL!

Here we go again! Yes, a lot of NOT NORMAL people come to this place in the middle of nowhere! On Saturday, March 6, 2021 we welcomed a wonderful group of NOT NORMAL people to Mission Central.

The mission minded members of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Carroll, Iowa came for a morning visit to see firsthand the NEW MISSIONARIES that God has called to go to Germany! Rev. Christian Tiews, his wife Lula, and their children Lillian and Miriam were here to give a program on their new calling and tell of their background being born and raised in Germany, which is now a land of great darkness.

A number of these special people had never seen the Lord's Creation Theater! As an added agenda item, these folks had the opportunity to hear what God did on the 6th day of Creation! This NOT NORMAL group gathered for a special showing in the theater! What a blessing to welcome these dear friends!



CIA Mission

Several months ago, I shared an article in The Messenger on how IOWAY had reinvented the Pony Express system. Now, for Pony Express, part 2. The following Pony Express adventure started with a phone call from Rosa Lee Enderton of First English Lutheran Church in Spencer. She asked if I knew a group or individuals who would be interested in lots of yarn. "How much yarn?" I asked.

Thirteen large garbage bags full of new yarn was the answer! Rosa shared that her sister in Plainview, Nebraska, had recently gone to heaven at age 62 following a brain tumor surgery. Her sister, Laurie Begay, had a stockpile of yarn since she made hundreds of hats, scarves and mittens and donated them to various organizations. I contacted Jo Reaman, member of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Webster City, and asked if she was interested in thirteen bags of yarn. Jo laughed and said, "Sure, we can use it!"

After several phone calls, the Pony Express journey was set with highway 20 as the route. Rosa Lee Enderton traveled to Plainview, Nebraska, which is on highway 20, to pack and load the

yarn into her pickup. The next stop was the Iowa District West office in Fort Dodge. I met her, along with Steve Doering and Rich Seiser, members of St. Paul Lutheran, Webster City. We transferred the yarn to their pick-up and the yarn continued its journey on highway 20 to Webster City where it will be mixed with a lot of love by the CIA and donated to people throughout the state and beyond.

Wait, how did the CIA get into this story? CIA (Christians In Action) is an amazing group of St. Paul members who make hundreds of items each year for missions. The CIA group is headed by Shirley Bowman and Jo Reaman. This group uses gifts of yarn to knit hats for the homeless and anyone in need. Some yarn is purchased through Thrivent Action Dollars, and some is donated or purchased by St. Paul members. Since January 2021, 541 hats have been donated to the IOWAY outreach for children at Moulton Elementary School in Des Moines.



Additional hats have been given to their local schools in Webster City and to their St. Paul Food Pantry. Three hundred of these hats were a labor of love made by a mission-minded, 93-year-young couple, Dr. E.F. Brown and his wife, Leora. They moved to Webster City in 1955. Dr. Brown was one of the organists for 40 years and the choir director for 50 years. Leora has served at the church in many capacities, and she has always had a heart for the work of the LWML (Lutheran Women's Missionary League).

In addition to the over 500 hats the CIA knit each year, they made over 50 fleece blankets. Shirley Bowman has personally made 100 pillowcase dresses!



The CIA members also keep the bandages "rolling." White sheets are torn into strips and rolled for bandages that are donated to Global Health Ministries for use in underdeveloped countries. Rich Seiser has made approximately 140 wooden bandage rollers. I have had the opportunity to distribute many of the bandage rollers to various groups/churches resulting in thousands of rolled bandages.

The CIA had a concern of how to continue this outreach after exhausting the supply of white sheets from members and friends. God always provides! Joe and Charlotte Sherman, St. Paul members, helped supply the need. When traveling, they inquire at each motel as they check-in and ask if they have any discarded white bedsheets. There were times when they returned to Webster City with half a trunk full of sheets. In January and February 2021, the CIA made 2,971 bandages. The group usually meets once a week, but during the past year, many members rolled bandages and made hats in their homes.
