

Ascension Day

This is a sermon preached by Rev. Will Weedon from St. Paul Lutheran Church in Hamel, IL. Since we do not have a special service on Ascension Day, May 13th, I thought it would be good to learn from a faithful pastor. Enjoy this sermon on what the Ascension of Jesus is and what it means for us today that "Jesus went away." Pastor Dose

Today the Church of Jesus Christ throughout the world celebrates His Ascension to the right hand of the Father, exalting our human nature beyond imagining, and preparing a place for us so that even now we are seated "in Him" in the heavenly places. This is what God prepared our humanity for from the get-go, but which we threw away in the Garden. This is what God restores to us in the redemption wrought in His Son. Here is a homily for the day:

Tonight, we meditate upon a single verse in our Gospel. These words: "So then, after the Lord had spoken to them, He was received up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God."

When you hear, "sat down" what do you think of? Do you picture Jesus sitting up in heaven, twiddling his thumbs, and waiting patiently for His Father to give Him the signal that the time has come to return again in glory? What is He up to as He sits at the right hand of the Father?

First thing we need to clear up is this right-hand business. The sacred writer is not giving you hints about heavenly geography, so that when you get to heaven, you'll know on which side of the Father to look to see the Lord Jesus. Right hand is bigger than that!

Recall the words of the Psalmist: "The right hand of the Lord does valiantly. The right hand of the Lord is exalted. The right hand of the Lord does valiantly." Ps. 118:16

The right hand of the Lord in scripture is not a place, but a power! It is almighty power. And so, to say that Jesus is seated at the right hand of God is to say that He has all power, that He rules and governs all things! Listen to how Paul said it in Ephesians: "He raised Christ from the dead and seated him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. And He put all things under His feet and gave Him to be head over all things to the Church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all." Eph 1:20-23

So, when we confess in the Creed that Jesus is seated at the right hand of the Father we confess that the human nature which He assumed from the womb of the Blessed Virgin, and in which He offered to God the sufficient ransom to release all people from the debt of sin and the power of death, that this human nature has now been exalted and raised above every height imaginable, given the exercise of all power in heaven and on earth. The One who bears in His hands the scars of the nails now rules over all!

So when I complain about the way things go in my life, when I gripe about the troubles of the world or of the Church, I am actually complaining about the way the Crucified and Risen One sees fit to govern, aren't I? Puts a different perspective on life, doesn't it? Me pitting my puny wisdom and ideas against the omnipotence and wisdom of Christ.

In the early days of the Church, this was not forgotten. Even as the persecutions raged and people died for the faith, they never forgot the One in charge. There is a writing called the Martyrdom of St. Polycarp that comes down to us from those earliest days of the Church. It is a fascinating little document, but where it really soars is at the end. Listen: "It was the second day of the first fortnight of Xanthicus, seven days before the calends of March, when our blessed Polycarp died his martyr's death two hours after midday on the Greater Sabbath. The official responsible for his arrest was Herod; the High Priest was Philip of Tralles; and the proconsul was

Statius Quadratus – BUT THE RULING MONARCH WAS JESUS CHRIST, WHO REIGNS FOREVER AND EVER. TO HIM BE ASCRIBED ALL GLORY, HONOR, MAJESTY, AND AN ETERNAL THRONE FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION." (Martyrdom of Polycarp, par. 21)

What confidence and peace those early Christians had as they remembered and confessed who sits upon the throne of this universe! It can give the same confidence and peace to us.

But there is even more to being seated at the right hand of God. Our Lord Jesus not only rules all things for the well-being of His holy Church! He also constantly intercedes for us before the Father. The writer to Hebrews put it this way: "Therefore He is able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them!" (Hebrews 7:25) For you, He prays. When you sin, He says to His Father, "Father, forgive. Look not upon the sin, but upon these scars that testify that I have answered for all their sin." Thus, He is our Mediator, the one who stands in the breach between us and God. His being Mediator did not cease when the work of the cross was done. He continues to be our Mediator by His unceasing intercession for us by which He saves us to the uttermost.

And yet there is even more. Since the "right hand of God" is not to be thought of as a place, but as a power, the Ascension of our Lord does not remove Him from us but brings Him closer to us. Oh, His visible presence is removed. But He is not removed. His promise stands forever: "Lo, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matt 28 St. Leo the Great got the hang of it. He preached to his parish in Rome: "The visible presence of Christ has passed into His sacraments." When you come to the altar today, you not only receive the Body and Blood that were offered in your place on Calvary's tree for the forgiveness of your sin! You receive the Body and Blood of Him who sits at the right hand of the Father, ruling over all things. Thus, Paul could rejoice that "He has raised us up together and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus." (Eph 2) The Sacrament lifts you that high!

How great then are the treasures contained in: "And sat down at the right hand of God." Ruling every circumstance, and so peace displaces our complaining. Interceding constantly for us, and joy drives out our anxieties. Constantly with us in His sacraments, and so we are never alone, but always with Him who sits at the right hand of God. Jesus, our Mediator. Jesus, our King. Jesus, our Risen, Ascended, and Glorified Lord, to whom with the Father and the Holy Spirit be all glory and honor now and ever and unto the ages of ages. Amen.



We hope these words, adapted from Phillips Brooks, will serve gradu-


ates well as they embark on their journeys:

In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offing is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. Special services like Advent, Lent, Christmas, etc are **NOT** automatically deducted and

we would encourage you to use your offering envelopes for those services just like in the past. For each person our Financial Secretary has to handle 52 envelopes and bookkeeping entries per year, and when you multiply that by approximately 275 envelope numbers, that is a significant amount of work that could be avoided by using the Simply Giving Program. An additional bonus would be that our giving throughout the year would be more consistent. We prayerfully ask that you consider making this small change that would be of big help. Over the years, Memorial Day has become a big holiday weekend. It's now the unofficial start of summer, rather than a day of tribute to the departed it was originally meant to be.

Even if we plan fun events for Memorial Day weekend, it's important to stop long enough to bow our heads and pay respect to our departed loved ones — especially those who fell in battle while helping preserve America's liberties.

Let us take time to make the pilgrimage to various cemeteries and pause long enough to say, "Thank you, Father, for these special lives, for sacrifices made and for friendships we have shared."

The price of freedom

In the song "What Did He Die For?" Twila Paris reminds us why we observe Memorial Day — and why we worship Jesus as our Savior. The first verse tells of a 21-year-old soldier fighting for America's freedom during World War II. The second verse recalls another young man, many centuries prior, sent by his Father to win eternal freedom from sin for the entire world.

The chorus offers this challenge:

"What did he die for when he died for you and me,

Made the sacrifice so that we could all be free?

I believe we will answer each to heaven

For the way we spend a priceless liberty.

Look inside and ask the question, What did he die for?"

Memorial Day challenges us to live so as to honor the sacrifices made by members of the military. We value our freedom because of the heavy price people have paid for it. Likewise, every day we're challenged to live so as to honor Jesus' supreme sacrifice. He calls us to spend our "priceless liberty" using our blessings to bless others.

How will they know?

A well-known 1960s song by Peter Scholtes answers an implied question: How will others know we're Jesus' disciples? Not by how we understand family values. Not by our politics or theology. Not by how many Bible verses we've memorized, how often we attend church or how much offering we give.

Rather, the song's title and refrain say it all: "They'll know we are Christians by our love." Jesus put it this way: "Everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:35, NIV).

Sometimes love involves words — teaching, proclaiming, bearing witness to God's presence. But if words aren't backed by actions, they soon fall flat. We can, as



Children Need Food and School Supplies

As we look around our community, church, state and nation, there will always be opportunities where we can extend a helping hand. God calls us to action in 1 John 3:18 – "Our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action."

One opportunity for action is to help families in Alderson, West Virginia by providing new backpacks and school supplies. In the past, through IOWAY, we reached out to help Christ Our Savior of the Valley Lutheran Church with two VBS mission teams and provided supplies. Pictured are some of the happy children who received backpacks and supplies from Iowans following our 2012 mission trip.

Pastor Richard Lohmeyer shared the following: "West Virginia is a poor mountainous state. The median income is \$24,478 which puts it last of the 50 states. It ranks 48th in health care and 50th in terms of the economy in the United States. It ranks 44th in education with only 27% having some type of college degree. Logging and coal production remain an important part of the state's economy, however, the sharp decline in the use of coal has led to a high unemployment rate and a use of drugs rate that is number one in the nation. The Alderson community last year saw twelve young people die because of drug overdoses. Good paying jobs are difficult to find, and the result is that many young people are leaving the state. West Virginia has the oldest population of the 50 states. In our community ALL school students receive both a free breakfast and lunch. They also receive a packed lunch to take home on Friday to ensure that they will have something to eat over the weekend. Our church is one of only four LCMS churches in the state of West Virginia. It is over a two-hour drive to the nearest LCMS Lutheran Church. We, at Christ Our Savior are an outpost doing acts of mercy in our community and sharing the Good News of God's love and forgiveness with the people."

How can we in Iowa District West lend a helping hand? I have recently been reporting on the IOWAY Pony Express. Dale and Deb Schmidt, St. Paul Lutheran Church, Carroll, are taking this to a whole new level! They offered to load up their vehicle and head to West Virginia in July!



Mercy Meals of Siouxland

Working with Mercy Meals of Siouxland is another great way to extend a helping hand. Would you like to be part of a team to pack meals on **July 24**, **2021**? We will pack meals from 10:30-Noon. Larry Joines shared, "Mercy Meals is a ministry of Faith Lutheran Church LCMS, Sioux City, Iowa. It began packaging fortified rice soy meals (Mercy Meals) for hungry and starving children in the U.S. and worldwide on June 23, 2012. Meals are packaged utilizing community volunteers ages 8 and up in an assembly line process. Meals consist of rice, soy, dried vegetables, and a vitamin/mineral base powder put into plastic bags containing 6 meals per bag. Each bag of 6 meals costs 72 cents to package. All meals are donated to Orphan Grain Train, Norfolk, Nebraska, and they ship the meals to destinations of their choosing at their cost. Meals are delivered at the point of destination by a Christian organization, so the children hear about Jesus as well as receiving food. The ministry has packaged and donated 2,138,387 Mercy Meals since June 23, 2012. The ministry is sustained through the generosity of donors who pay for the materials and supplies used to package meals. 



For the 2021 tax year, the legislature has allocated \$15,000,000 for Tuition Tax Credits for the STO program across the state of lowa so ILSTO will have \$553,416 in tax credits to distribute to donors and has set a goal to raise \$940,000. We are currently at 5% of our goal. The tax credit limit for the STO program will rise 10% in 2022 if all the STOs in lowa can fund at 90% in 2021. 
