This month we celebrate Thanksgiving. Many lament that Thanksgiving gets passed over for the more important holiday, Christmas. So let's buck that trend and let's spend time talking about Thanksgiving. We know it is a "national or federal" holiday. It is a holiday that does not have its true origins in the Bible like Christmas or Easter does. It is a holiday that recognizes the peace between the Pilgrims and Native Americans in the Massachusetts area of America. This is oversimplifying the holiday, but at its core, this is what it indicates, a praise or thanksgiving to God for all the blessing he provided in coming to America and settling in this new land.

We have numerous Bible passages that deal with thanksgiving. The two that are part of the propers (readings) for the Divine Service on Thanksgiving Eve are from Psalm 67:6 and Philippians 4:6-7. Both of these see God as the one who gives to us his gifts and blessings then we in turn respond to him with thanksgiving. All that we have in this life is a gift and a blessing from God. The Fourth Petition

Give us this day our daily bread.

What does this mean?

God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.

What is meant by daily bread?

Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.

I want to use this Newsletter article to catechize. It is good for us to think using the Scriptures and Luther's Small Catechism. The catechism is a handbook for the Christian life and faith. Look at the list Luther lays out here many things apply today just as they did 500 years ago. This Thanksgiving, we can be thankful and thoughtful for the gifts and blessings God gives to us.

That's what Advent is really all about: God visiting the earth in person to speak with anyone and everyone who is ready to do so.

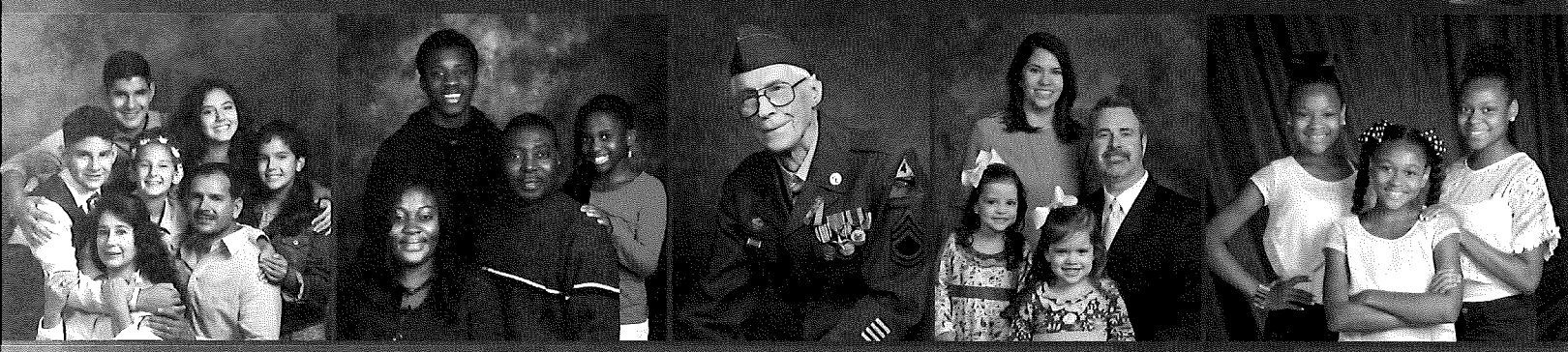
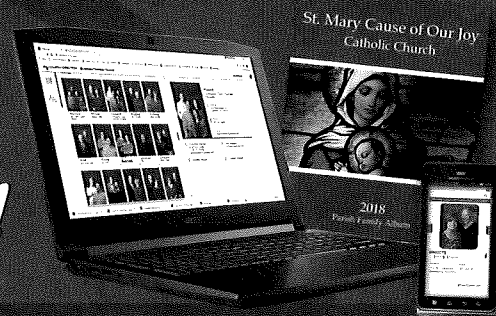
God's precious saints

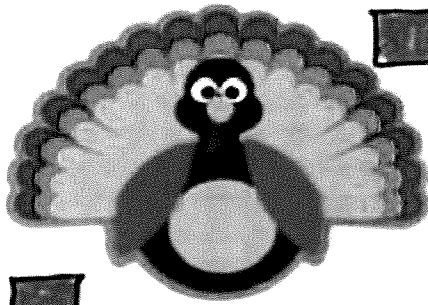

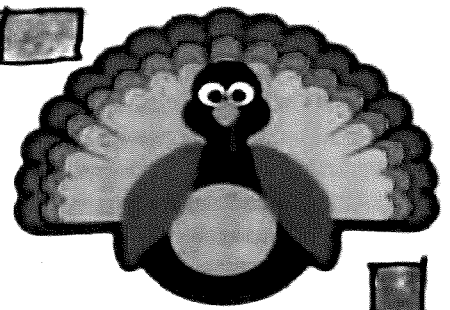
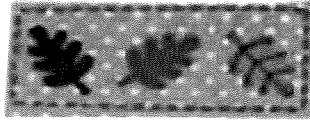


Online Scheduling Available!

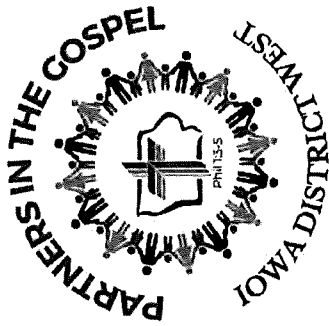

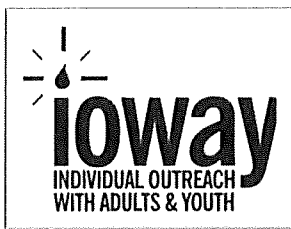

Thank You from Haiti

Join me in praising God for the very generous people of Iowa District West! Many individuals and churches have responded to the needs of the people of Haiti. Ten years ago, I became involved with our outreach to Haiti after meeting Reverend Doctor Marky Kessa, Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti and Jackie Rychel, President and founder of Ministry in Mission. Recently, I asked Jackie to share her thoughts concerning the involvement of Iowa District West members with Haiti. She shared the following information.

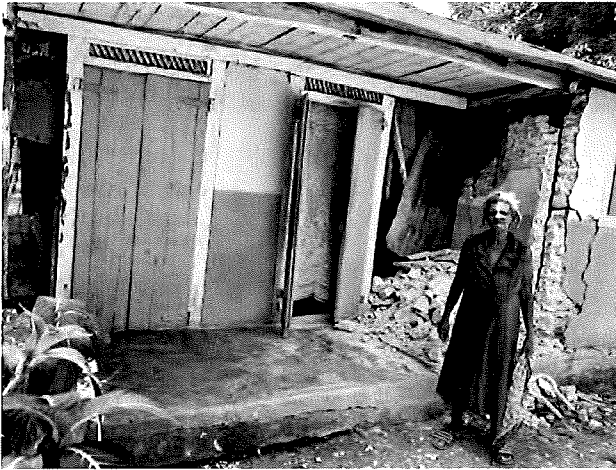
“Ministry in Mission is a Recognized Service Organization of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. The mission statement of Ministry in Mission is **‘to further the Kingdom of Jesus Christ at home and abroad.’**

“The main effort to achieve the mission statement is demonstrated by the ongoing and completed projects, for the last decade, primarily in Haiti. The years have displayed many challenges for the missionaries visiting Haiti but more so for the citizens of Haiti that we serve. Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. In the time Ministry in Mission has escorted mission teams to the country, while only 700 miles off the Miami coast, we have seen many challenges. There have been two major earthquakes, multiple hurricanes and tropical storms, severe hunger and starvation, food and fuel shortages, gang activity including shootings, kidnappings, roadblocks, homes looted and burned, inadequate medical services, a corrupt government, and the assassination of the president.

“So, you see, one needs courage and a great deal of faith to step out and serve in a place where everyday life is so different from life in America. In 2011, when I first met Ellie Menz, she asked if an IOWAY team could serve in Haiti. The first team that ventured out was a team of seven high school youth led by four mission-minded adults. That team set the standard. That trip was followed by seven teams who when asked if they were interested in a trip to Haiti the reply was a resounding SEND ME! Following that first trip, not only was a School Sponsorship program started by a willing volunteer, but it is still going strong today with hundreds of students sponsored each school year.

“Next came the ladies who were powerful fundraisers. They spread the word about Haiti at every LWML gathering they attended. After them, were the repeat missionaries that had a vision and picked up on ideas from the needs of the Haitians themselves. Then an unsolicited phone call came requesting information on an international mission trip opportunity. That call prompted the partnership with Lutheran Family Service of Iowa. Ministry in Mission was mentored and assisted by the award-winning team of pastors and medical professional staff of Perry Lutheran Home. The entire Leadership Team advised, directed, taught, prayed, and helped physically move the very first residents into the newly constructed Jacmel Home for the elderly.

“Iowa District West has been an extension of Ministry in Mission in Haiti. Led by Ellie Menz, the IOWAY group has been selected by God and driven by the Holy Spirit to further the kingdom of Jesus Christ in Haiti. In the past two months since the last earthquake, Iowa District West members donated nearly \$10,000 for disaster response. In addition, School Sponsorships for 2021 to date is over \$20,000.



“There has not been a week that has gone by without a call, text, email, letter or card asking how they can help. When we at Ministry in Mission have prayed to the Lord for a solution to a dilemma often the answer comes from Iowa West. One such prayer was answered in record speed. Pastor Marky Kessa, our partner in Haiti working on the current disaster response to the most recent earthquake, asked for help to rebuild a house for a lady who has been cooking for the construction workers in Maniche, Haiti. The school that doubles as a church on Sundays was partially destroyed. As we were trying to

repair the structure to open for the new school year, a neighbor was asked to prepare meals for the workers. Pictured is the lady outside her house which had major damage (note the crumbled cement behind her) but she humbly put that aside and prepared meals for the workers to help the project move forward quickly.

“Pastor Marky called and said, ‘I know money is designated for church construction but if you can find \$3,500 to help this lady it would be very good for her and her family.’ After praying for a couple of weeks for the additional money to come through, a decision was made in faith to send an additional \$3,500 with the next wire specifically for the repair of the lady’s home. Within two hours of sending that wire, Ellie Menz sent a text stating Ministry in Mission would be receiving a check soon for \$3,500 to add to the sum of disaster response money already donated. Praise God!”
