Come and join us in the celebration this Advent and Christmas season.

#### Symbols of Salvation: Foretelling Christ's Birth

Ordinarily, when we think of Old Testament prophecies of the birth of Christ, we have in mind specific verses such as, "The virgin shall conceive and bear a son" (Isaiah 7:14); "Unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given" (Isaiah 9:6); and "From you [O Bethlehem] shall come forth for Me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days" (Micah 5:2). These direct prophecies point clearly to the coming of Jesus as the Savior Messiah.


But in addition to these wonderful verses, Jesus teaches us that, in fact, the entire Old Testament prophesies about Him—"And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, [Jesus] interpreted to them *in all the Scriptures* the things concerning *Himself*" (Luke 24:27, emphasis added). "For to this day, when they read the old covenant, that same veil remains unlifted, *because only through Christ is it taken away*" (2 Corinthians 3:14, emphasis added). "You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; *and it is they that bear witness about Me*" (John 5:39, emphasis added). All of the Bible is about Jesus. From the very beginning of creation, the ways God interacts with His people give us living symbols that foreshadow and foretell Jesus' advent among us in the flesh. As the hymn puts it,

For deep in prophets' sacred page, And grand in poets' winged word, Slowly in type, from age to age The nations saw their coming Lord. (*LSB* 810:2)

The various "types" in the Old Testament point to a complete fulfillment in Jesus. He is the perfect Israel and the culmination of its divinely given institutions. He is the embodiment of the Scriptures, for "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). The Old Testament is not just a historical record; it was and continues to be the active, Spirit-filled Word of God that proclaims Christ to us.

The Advent sermons in this series focus on three particular Old Testament narratives that serve as symbols of Jesus' coming to share in our humanity: the burning bush, the cloud in the tabernacle, and the call of Gideon. The Christmas sermon then focuses on how the narrative of Jesus' birth is no fairy tale but a true story that

also foretells the purpose of Jesus' incarnation. Jesus takes on our flesh so that He might die in the flesh for our sins and be raised bodily for our justification (Romans 4:25). All of Scripture finds its culmination and fulfillment in Him. May God the Father, by the power of the Holy Spirit, bless our meditation this season on Him who is the Word made flesh!



#### **Praising God for IOWAY**



Eighty-five people enjoyed a delicious meal by Feed Shed Catering from Moorland, Iowa, compliments of Carole White, LCEF (Lutheran Church Extension Fund). Following the meal, there were three presenters and numerous thank yous to the many volunteers who honor God by serving others.


Audri LuUhlken thanked lowa District West members for all the amazing donations received for the 530 students at Moulton Elementary School in Des Moines.





Ashley Vaala, director of Lotus Community Project (women's shelter) north of Fort Dodge in the former St. John Lutheran Church of Vincent, shared her journey of drug addiction and homelessness which led her to start the Lotus Project to house homeless women and children.

Pastor Pedro Lopez, Hispanic Ministry for Iowa District West in the Storm Lake and Denison areas, shared the need for the Gospel of Christ to reach our Hispanic population.



Pastor Aaron Zimmermann, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Farnhamville and Immanuel Lutheran Church, Pomeroy, shared an outreach called *Swaddling Clothes* they recently started. It provides diapers, clothes, and items needed for infants.

Through IOWAY, we were able to help meet some of the needs of the following: Moulton Elementary School, Des Moines; Capitol View Elementary School, Des Moines; Takin' It To The Streets homeless outreach in Council Bluffs; Beacon of Hope Men's Shelter in Fort Dodge; Lotus Community Project Women's Shelter near Fort Dodge; Crossroads of Crawford County/prolife center; Haiti earthquake relief; and Hurricane Ida relief efforts in Metairie, Louisiana.

Making knit hats may not seem like a big deal, but the Farnhamville "Hat Makers" Frank Morgan made over 1,000 hats and Larry Hicks made 1,400 infant hats in a year, that is a big deal to the 2,400 people who receive them! Members of Emmanuel Lutheran, Lake View made over 400 hats. The CIA (Christians in Action) from St. Paul Lutheran Church in Webster City made over 2,000. Betty Nobiling, Carroll, made 900 in the past two years. And the list goes on and on as many more people were involved in making beautiful hats.

There is a need for many infant/newborn hats for Global Health Ministries in Minneapolis. They in turn send the infant hats throughout the world along with other items.

Something seemingly unimportant, like worn-out bedsheets, become very important when many people rip them into strips and roll them into bandages. Over 10,000 bandages have been made and given to Global Health Ministries to distribute to many impoverished areas where there is a need. The majority of the bandages were made by the CIA group from Webster City.

Scraps of material have become part of over 900 quilts that have been made and distributed through IOWAY in Iowa District West. The TLC Quilters of Trinity Lutheran Church in Algona made 600 quilts. If you have and/or wish to collect bedsheets for the TLC Quilters, they are in need of flat, any size, any color bedsheets. Contact me for Barb Bitterman's phone number if you have sheets to donate. Roy Hutchison of Algona has made 70 body pillows for homeless and near homeless youth in Des Moines!

What can a colored plastic bead do to share the love of Jesus? Seven colored beads on a leather strip and a card explaining what Jesus did for our salvation is very simple but powerful. Mary Reed, St. Paul Lutheran Church, Boone has made 140,000 witness bracelets in the past 15 years that have been distributed throughout lowa District West and beyond.

In the past 20 years, IOWAY has become like a huge oak tree with lots of branches. At the banquet, we were able to celebrate some of the branches. Time did not allow to highlight many of the things each of you have done. Thank you to everyone who has been involved in donating time and/or money.

At this writing, members and churches of Iowa District West have donated \$9,000 for Haiti relief and over \$13,000 for Hurricane Ida relief! God uses the gifts, talents, skills, and enthusiasm of many volunteers to make a difference in their lives and in the lives of others.
