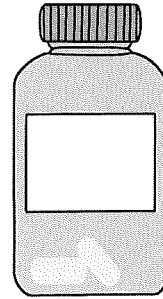

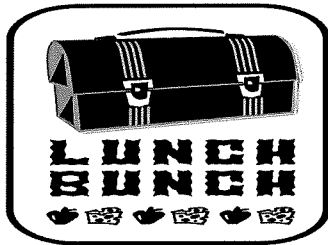

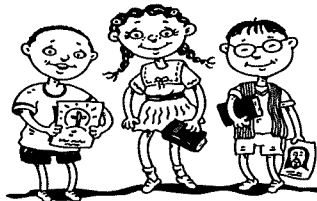

Congratulations to the members of our congregation who are graduating! No doubt you are looking forward to the next phase of your lives with excitement, anticipation and perhaps a little apprehension.


We hope these words, adapted from Phillips Brooks, will serve graduates well as they embark on their journeys:

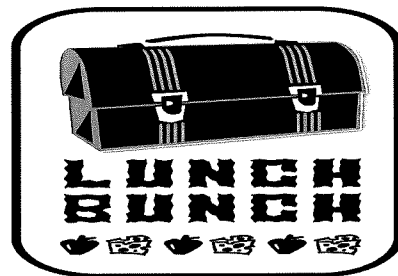

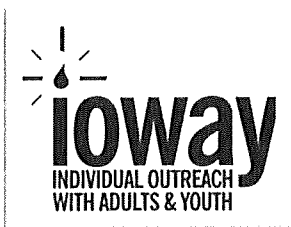

Our Youth ... Valuable Investment



The main mission of the church is to spread the Gospel and present faith-building opportunities to all members, young and old. The “dropout” rate of youth in our churches is very discouraging. How are we doing in reaching our youth? In the present culture of counter-Christian values, our youth need special opportunities. One such opportunity is spending a week immersed in Spirit-filled activities at Camp Okoboji. Recently, at Trinity Lutheran Church in Jefferson, two young moms shared some unforgettable memories from their time at camp when they were young. They want the same experiences for their children. How can we make that happen?

Camp Okoboji runs a quality program and with that comes expenses. For some families, it is a financial burden to send their children to camp even knowing it would be a great experience. If financial stress is taken away, it makes camp possible. Secondly, many youth are reluctant to go to camp by themselves, especially if they have never been there. Yet, if a friend can go with them, it's more appealing. They, and the friend each have someone to lean on and it isn't so scary. It is also a great way to introduce Jesus to young people who may have no church connection. It could be a life changing adventure as they learn about the love of Jesus.



At our recent LWML meeting at Trinity Lutheran in Jefferson, we discussed how we could encourage and support our youth to attend a summer camp at Camp Okoboji.

One idea was to provide \$50 to each young person to attend camp. Of course, that led to a discussion of how many young people might be interested. The cost of tuition differs with each camp during the summer. The cost of camp varies from \$135 - \$370. Providing \$50 won't tip the scales. If a family has more than one child, the cost is unmanageable for many young families and \$50 of assistance won't help their budget enough to make a difference.

Another idea was to provide full tuition for any family that couldn't afford it. While that sounds generous, it usually means that nobody will apply. Pride enters the picture. They will not apply and admit they can't afford it even if it means their child can't go to camp.

It was also suggested one half of the cost would be covered by the LWML. This also was open-ended since nobody knew how many would be interested.

At the end of Sunday's worship service (yes, our LWML meets on Sunday at 8:15 AM 😊), it was announced that our LWML would like to help with the cost of camp and to let us know if they were interested. Families were encouraged to begin thinking and talking about camp. Instructions were given on how to obtain enrollment forms for their children.

The Holy Spirit was working! During our coffee and fellowship time after services, a member quietly told me that they would donate up to \$3,000 to cover the cost of any youth who wants to go to camp this summer. That blew me away, but it got better! Later in the afternoon, another member called and made the very same offer! Both individuals asked to remain anonymous!

With this great turn of events, more discussion was held. With the approval of both anonymous donors, it was decided to fully fund any of Trinity's youth and to also fully-fund a friend if they wanted to share the adventure. At this writing, fifteen youth are interested! That is huge for our congregation! I am sure more will be registering.

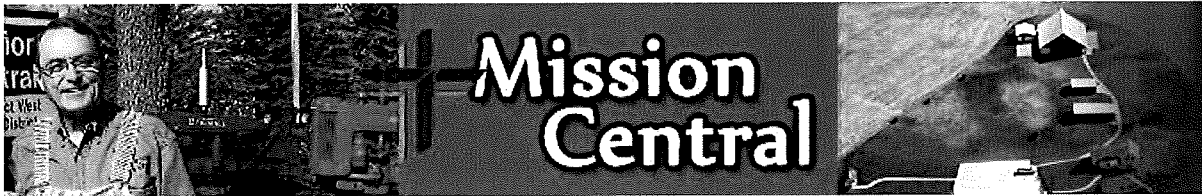
The response has been wonderful and we at Trinity are very excited about the Christ-filled experience each of our youth will have at Camp Okoboji. When all applications are set, the donors will give their offering to the church and the church will send one check to Camp Okoboji.

You may be thinking that it all sounds good, but you don't have people interested in funding such an amazing outreach. How do you know? We had no idea! It has never happened before. I invite you to think outside of the box. What about offering it? What about using some of your endowment money? How about including it in the yearly budget?

And let's get serious. We all say we want young families and children in our congregations but what are we as a congregation doing to encourage them? There are other ways to offer encouragement, but having youth immersed in God's Word with other Christian youth at Camp Okoboji certainly is a great place to begin.

Let's invest in our youth! Some congregations have been given land or large cash gifts from estates, etc. Many have endowments that produce annual income for their congregation. Fully funding the cost of camp, would be a wonderful investment in the faith life of your youth. If your congregation has been so blessed, this is something you might consider. It certainly is an outreach and a way to spread the Gospel and bring youth into a closer relationship with Jesus! In addition to being a great benefit for the youth, the parents feel appreciated and valued.

Over the years, Memorial Day has become a big holiday weekend. It's now the unofficial start of summer, rather than a day of tribute to the departed it was originally meant to be.

Even if we plan fun events for Memorial Day weekend, it's important to stop long enough to bow our heads and pay respect to our departed loved ones — especially those who fell in battle while helping preserve America's liberties.

Let us take time to make the pilgrimage to various cemeteries and pause long enough to say, "Thank you, Father, for these special lives, for sacrifices made and for friendships we have shared."

The price of freedom

In the song "What Did He Die For?" Twila Paris reminds us why we observe Memorial Day — and why we worship Jesus as our Savior. The first verse tells of a 21-year-old soldier fighting for America's freedom during World War II. The second verse recalls another young man, many centuries prior, sent by his Father to win eternal freedom from sin for the entire world.

The chorus offers this challenge:

"What did he die for when he died for you and me,
Made the sacrifice so that we could all be free?
I believe we will answer each to heaven
For the way we spend a priceless liberty.
Look inside and ask the question, What did he die for?"

Memorial Day challenges us to live so as to honor the sacrifices made by members of the military. We value our freedom because of the heavy price people have paid for it. Likewise, every day we're challenged to live so as to honor Jesus' supreme sacrifice. He calls us to spend our "priceless liberty" using our blessings to bless others.

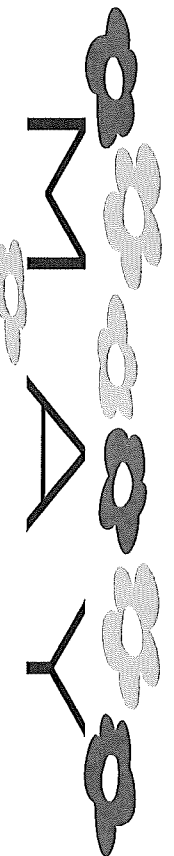
How will they know?

A well-known 1960s song by Peter Scholtes answers an implied question: How will others know we're Jesus' disciples? Not by how we understand family values. Not by our politics or theology. Not by how many Bible verses we've memorized, how often we attend church or how much offering we give.

Rather, the song's title and refrain say it all: "They'll know we are Christians by our love." Jesus put it this way: "Everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:35, NIV).

Sometimes love involves words — teaching, proclaiming, bearing witness to God's presence. But if words aren't backed by actions, they soon fall flat. We can, as

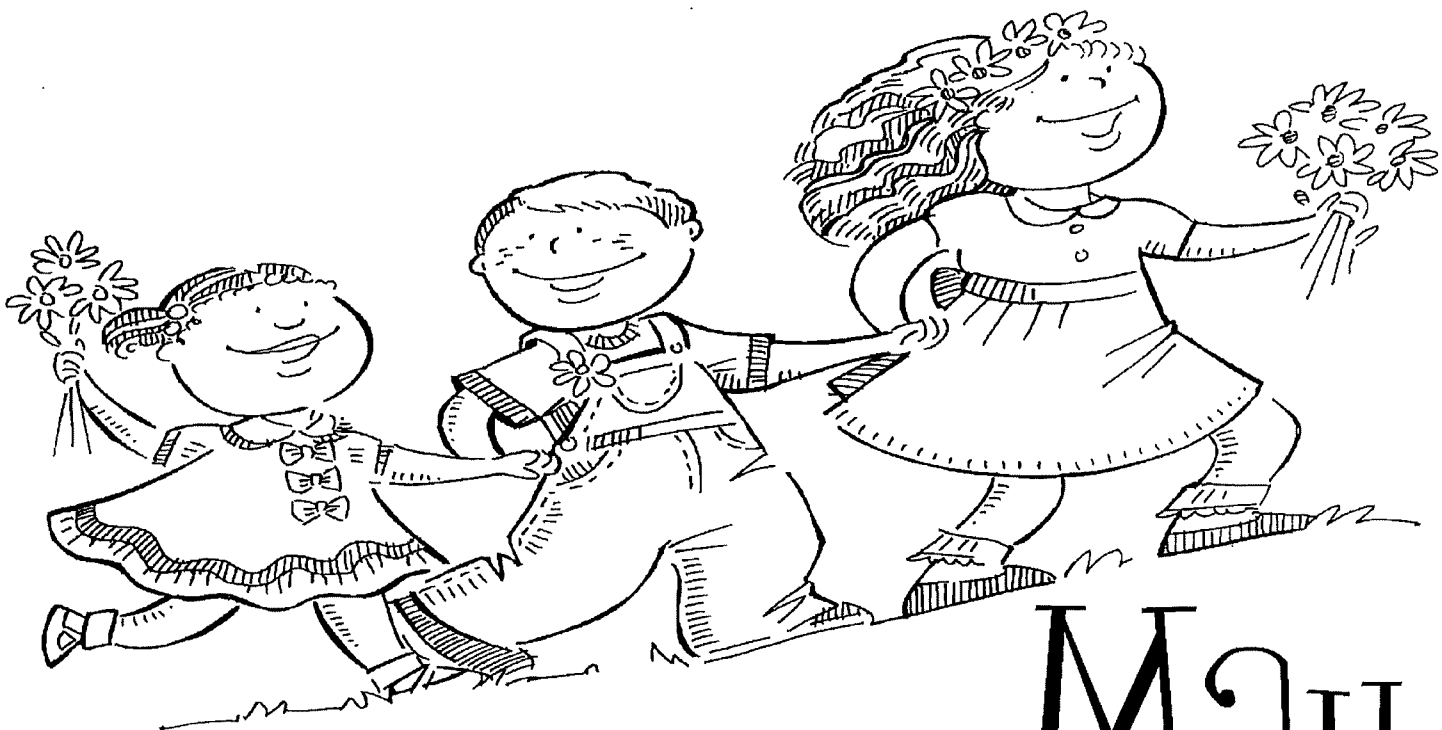
