The Tree of Life: God's Promise of Salvation

The Tree of Life Vacation Bible School

The Bible is the story of God's mission to save His creation through His Son, Jesus Christ. The Tree of Life: God's Promise of Salvation is a series of resources that will help people of all ages better understand the grand story of salvation. The resource can be used over ten weeks as a congregation-wide resource or in fewer lessons as part of a flexible teaching resource. Each lesson will cover a different Bible account that guides us through the epic story of salvation from creation, to the cross, to Christ's return on the Last Day.

The first five lessons will focus on the Old Testament, while the next five will feature lessons in the New Testament. We will begin with creation and the fall into sin, which brought all the problems we experience in this world, including hate, prejudice, crime, war, sickness, and death. Then we will look at God's promise to send His Son to save us. That promise unfolded throughout the history of God's Old Testament people: Abraham, Moses, King David, and Daniel.


In the second half, we will focus on Jesus' coming as our Savior. We will look at His birth and Baptism, His ministry, His suffering and death, His resurrection, and His promise to return on the Last Day to judge the living and the dead. By the end of these ten lessons, your congregation will understand the Bible's overarching theme and storyline, the key to unlocking the full riches of each page of Holy Scripture.

May 31-June 3rd, we'll be holding Vacation Bible School called The Tree of Life: God's Promise of Salvation. This VBS examines God's plan of salvation through His Son, Jesus Christ.

Each session of this VBS explores Bible accounts that guide us through the epic story of salvation, from creation in the beginning of Genesis, to the cross of Christ in the beginning of the New Testament, and finally to Jesus' return on the Last Day in the Book of Revelation.

Be sure to join us for fun lessons, music, crafts, snacks, and activities to learn how Jesus' cross became the tree of life in which God forgives us and gives us everlasting life.




REMINDERS: 1) Students are reminded that "good" clothes should NOT be worn as some craft projects can be kind of messy. 2) Daily

In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. All you will need to do is once a week (or whatever you choose) is to record the amount in your check register. That is all there is to it. The amount is set by you and doesn't change unless you request it to be changed or discontinued. Special services like Advent, Lent, Christmas, etc are **NOT** automatically deducted and we would encourage you to use your offering envelopes for those services just like in the past. For each person our Financial Secretary has to handle 52 envelopes and bookkeeping entries per year, and when you multiply that by approximately 250 envelope numbers, that is a significant amount of work that could be avoided by using the Simply Giving Program. An additional bonus would be that our giving throughout the year would be more consistent. We prayerfully ask that you consider making this small change that would be of big help. 



Faith Based Mission Trip! Which Way, Lord?

Lori Lyons, St. Paul Lutheran Church, Schaller, Iowa, has been leading faith-based mission trips since 2011. What are these mission trips? It involves heading out in the church van on a Saturday morning with absolutely NO idea where they will be going, where they will spend the night, or who they will meet. They rely solely on God leading them to serve His people. The funding for blessing others has been provided by their church and community. This year, they received \$1,637.57 to be used to bless those who God directed them to.



On February 19, Caden Biede, Kyler Wunschel, Klay Grieme, Mallory McDonough and Lori Lyons headed out with excitement and anticipation of where the next two days would take them. Lori Lyons has been doing faith-based mission trips with youth since hearing about them from a speaker at a Senior Youth Gathering. After hearing about the adventures shared by the speaker, Lori was asked if they could do that. Lori said, "Absolutely!"

As this year's trip started with the first suggestions of "left, right or straight," the group

found they were heading east on Highway 20. They post their location on social media and ask people to contact them with names of people who are in need. Following those suggestions, they went to Sac City where they "paid it forward" at Rosie's Coffee Shop and purchased a gift card for groceries for a very giving family that includes four children with disabilities. Lori shared, "Their life isn't easy, but they are willing to serve others. It was time to give to them!" The group also gave a financial gift to a gentleman who has cancer and his wife is his caregiver.

The team members gave "left, right or straight commands," and they ended up in Pocahontas. There they gave a gas card to a gentleman who has cancer and needed to be able to get to doctors' appointments. They learned of a two-year-old from Spirit Lake who has leukemia. The Pocahontas grocery store was supporting the efforts to raise money for her, so the group made a donation. While in the grocery store, they learned of a woman dealing with many health issues in addition to her husband's cancer. The group decided to gift this couple with a gas card.

Emmetsburg was the next stop for the group. They learned that a member's grandfather lives at assisted living. Although COVID lock-down prohibited them from a visit, they left some sweet treats. At lunch, they left a note for the waitress stating, "We are all called to serve. Thank you for serving us." A generous tip was given to bless her.

Heading out, they learned that the family of the two-year-old with cancer was open to a visit! After purchasing fun bath time activities and toys, they were on their way towards Spirit Lake!

Their next stop was Fairmont, Minnesota where Caden's Grandma Ruth lives. After a phone call to Ruth, she was on a mission to find some great opportunities for the group to serve. She suggested visiting an elderly

couple dealing with Alzheimer's. The group decided to surprise them with flowers and ice cream. Ruth's friend is dealing with cancer. Because of gas prices and the need for follow-up care, she was given a gas card. The team then went to meet with a gentleman who had fallen the day before and broke his leg and was dealing with a lot of pain. Knowing that his upcoming surgery and doctor visits would involve traveling, another gas gift card deemed appropriate. While visiting with him, he shared a beautiful analogy about a turtle. We can be a turtle, stay inside our shell and be comfortable or we can poke our head out, use our feet and head and go! The turtle story was another reminder that we need to "GO! GO serve Jesus!"

They journeyed to Truman, Minnesota where they delivered a bouquet of beautiful flowers, left a generous tip for the waitress for their evening meal, and gave a gift card to a wonderful couple who opened their home for the group to spend the night. The next day, they worshipped at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Truman, Minnesota where they met a mother of five who is battling cancer. They gave her a financial gift to help with family needs.

They returned to Fairmont, Minnesota and met with a loving lady who blessed the group with money for their lunch! Once again, it was learned that they can never outgive God!

Back to "left, right, straight" and a new path meant a stop in Armstrong, Iowa where they "paid it forward" in Casey's. They continued on to Algona where they met with a couple, married 65 years, dealing with cancer along with many health issues. The couple portrayed a beautiful example of servanthood and shared God's love

As the trip was coming to an end, one last stop was in Fort Dodge. The Blessing Box in Schaller is a youth project that serves many needs in the Schaller community. The group shopped and made sure the shelves would continue to be filled with groceries for those in need.

Reflections of the team after their 690-mile faith-based adventure:

Caden: "This trip really showed me how God is always working. The people we met had some bad things happen to them, but their faith in God helped them to get through it. It showed me that God has a plan and if you trust in Him, He will help you through the tough times."

Kyler: "This trip was such an eye opener, just like it was the first time I went. There are so many people who are going through such hard things. It's our purpose to go and serve God's people. It's what we need to do!"

Klay: "On this trip, I was shown how God is everywhere. There was always someone to bless. God led us to a lot of cool people, and it was fun being able to bless them. This trip showed me how good it feels to help others. I would recommend that others go on this trip!"

Mal: "The faith-based mission trip served as another reminder that God is in control and had an incredible path laid out for us. We met some amazing people but the ones that always tug at my heart a little extra are the kids dealing with health issues. I know how lucky we are to have healthy children, but it makes me really appreciate our own health even more. We never know what tomorrow will bring but we know who holds us each day of our lives. Each of these people we met made an impact on us and we, as a family at home, will continue to pray for all of them!"

Lori: "I have been involved with all of the past faith-based mission trips. EVERY time, God reveals a little different scenario but always the same resolution – LOVE. It's like He screams to me 'let all you do be done in love' (1 Corinthians 16:14). He gently reminds me. 'We love because he first loved us' (1 John 4:19). I love watching 'my kids' stand in front of complete strangers and tell them what and why we do this. I love seeing the reaction of people when they get unexpected 'love gifts.' I love being reminded that we are saved to serve. I love knowing that I am loved! Now, I encourage you to Love – to serve – to have your own 'come to Jesus' and GO serve Him."


