Six youth and two adults from Zion Lutheran Church in Arcadia traveled to Houston, TX for the 15th LCMS Youth Gathering July 7-July 13. The six youth who attended were, Jonathan & Timothy Dose, Danica Ehlers, Jaggar and Jaxx Luetje, and Ethan Osterlund. The two adult chaperones were Pastor Ben Dose and Maddie Owen.

The group traveled by airline to Houston from Omaha and for some it was their first time flying which is always exciting and nerve wracking for some. The group stayed at the Royal Sonesta Galleria Hotel. It was in the "west loop" of Houston by the Galleria Mall.

Thursday and Friday, the 7th and 8th, were the group's tourist days. They spent time on Thursday at Minute Maid Park watching the Houston Astros beat the Kansas City Royals 5-2. Friday was spent at the Houston Zoo.

Saturday through Wednesday were the days spent at the LCMS Youth Gathering. The days consisted of a large Bible study with 4,000 other youth and adults led by professional church workers. Then the group could split up and attend small group sessions lead by various adults in the George Brown Convention Center. Also, the gathering had an experiential floor with booths and tables set up by various universities and seminaries and each district of the LCMS had a boot to explain what they were about, and they did. Each participant of the group spent some time there during the afternoon hours as well. At supper time the group would come back together and eat and discuss the afternoon's sessions or time on the floor. The evening would consist of attending the Mass Event.

The Mass Event is where 20,000 people come together for a time of worship, prayer, encouraging messages, and teaching. This is where you realize in the body of Christ you are not alone. Especially being from rural small-town Iowa, the Mass Events are uplifting for the faith of the youth and adults. The Mass Events would take place in Minute Maid Park where the Houston Astros play their games. Following the Mass Events the group would wait outside in line with other groups from around the country for a shuttle to take them back to their hotels in the west loop.

All in all the group from Zion had a good time. They learned what it meant that Christ is In All Things from Colossians 1:15-20. It was faith impacting trip to be encouraged that so many people just like them believe the same thing. It was inspiring to receive Holy Communion with 20,000 other youth and adults.

Dress a Girl – Des Moines

A small piece of material, bias tape, and elastic seem very unimportant and not of much value. That is until a person takes those items and adds love and prayers to make a beautiful dress for a girl around the world.

Many are familiar with and have made "pillowcase dresses." I have sent many dresses made by women in Iowa District West to Haiti and Mexico in the past. There are now fewer mission teams going into Haiti and the postage to send the dresses to a friend in California who takes them into Mexico is very costly.

I was recently introduced to Dress a Girl which has an organization in Des Moines. It is a fascinating outreach to girls throughout the world. The Des Moines group was started by Donna Moore.



Donna shares how she got involved, "I started sewing in junior high school. I was never a fabulous seamstress but made curtains, simple clothes, and projects of all kinds. I hadn't sewn in years, but I became involved in Dress a Girl in Rochester, New York. It was part of an organization called Angels of Mercy which addresses the abuse and trafficking of women. They started making dresses about 7 years ago. I loved the idea and joined the group. We then relocated to Des Moines, Iowa. From the day we made the decision to move, getting involved in

Dress a Girl was my goal. I wanted to join a group in Des Moines to help me meet new people and make dresses for this wonderful organization. Much to my amazement, there was no such group. In fact, hardly anyone had heard of it. Not to be discouraged, I decided to start a group.

"We moved into a senior independent living residence and was able to use their craft room to start the group. The next thing we needed was the materials. There's a church next door so I asked if they had any outreach programs. They invited me to speak to their ladies' organization. As a result, their group gave us our first donation and the best part was that three of the ladies joined our group. We bought some fabric, had an organizing meeting, and our small but dedicated group made 45 dresses in a few weeks. We had no idea where we would send the dresses, but I had the faith that by the time we had enough made, we'd know.

"I believe in God incidences. You know, things that happen without our direction and totally out of our control. After 4 months we have made almost 200 dresses! The real joy comes when I see photos of the smiling faces of little girls as they twirl around in their very own dress. Knowing the pride, self-confidence, and feeling of being beautiful, they may be experiencing for the very first time!"

To learn more about the outreach, check out dressagirlaroundtheworld.com. You may use pillowcases. but their main focus is to make them from cotton or cotton blend material. The site offers a pattern, templates for different sizes of dresses, dress a girl labels, etc. Why is a label to be sewn on the front of the dress? Village pastors share that giving a girl a new dress raises her dignity as well as how she is



viewed by others. That indicates to predators that this girl is under the care of an organization. If you are not into sewing, but would like to help, consider cutting the material, elastic and bias tape and put into a zip lock. Others will be happy to sew the dresses. Consider asking your congregation for donations of the items needed. Also ask for pretty lace and buttons. Dress a Girl does not insist on it but would like for the dresses to have a pocket. A pocket is a fun place for the girls to put special things.

For Thrivent members, consider purchasing needed supplies with your Thrivent card.

Please contact me if you are interested in this outreach and we can work out the details of delivery of the dresses. At this writing, I have delivered 297 dresses and will soon deliver 69 more to Dress a Girl.


