"DOSE OF WISDOM"

Have you ever heard this quote: "Every disappointment involves unmet expectations." Most pastors talk about what expectations for marriage are realistic or unrealistic. We also let them know that their spouse will inevitably let them down—sometimes multiple times a day!

Marriage is not the only source of disappointment and unmet expectations. Every human relationship will deal with these issues. Have you been happy with *every* decision an elected official has made, even one for whom you voted? Does your boss ever let you down? Have your employees always done their job well? Do your friends always come through for you? Do your children always make good and wise decisions based on what you have taught them?

Human beings *will* disappoint by failing to meet expectations. No wonder the psalmist tells us in Psalm 146:3–4, "Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation. When his breath departs, he returns to the earth; on that very day his plans perish."

Parents have hopes and expectations for their children. Sometimes these are healthy expectations. Other times parents place unfair or unrealistic expectations on their children. This upcoming Advent season, during our midweek services, we will look at three different sons of men who were disappointments to their fathers.

In the first week, we will be introduced to Cain, the son of Adam. No doubt Adam had higher hopes for Cain than for him to be known as the first murderer in history. But his murder of his brother reveals the murder lurking in all of our hearts.

In the second week, we will be introduced to Ishmael, the son of Abraham. Though it was not his fault, Ishmael was a disappointment to Abraham because he was not the child of the promise. Abraham's efforts to take things into his own hands highlight our own tendency to do the same in our relationship with God.

In the third week, we will be introduced to Absalom, the son of David. This rebellious son broke David's heart and exposes the rebellion we display against our heavenly Father.

But each week, we will also be pointed to a different Son. This Son is the true Son of Adam. He is the true Son of Abraham. He is the true Son of David. He is the Son who never disappointed His Father. He is the Son who never did any wrong. He is the Son of whom the Father spoke: "This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him" (Matthew 17:5). This true Man, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, is also the Son of God, the very Son of God now living in our flesh and blood. This Son is Jesus, the Christ, the Messiah, who fulfills the hope of salvation "that we might receive adoption as sons" (Galatians 4:5). He is the One whom the psalmist spoke of in Psalm 146:5: "Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord his God."

During this series, entitled *This Is My Son*, you will hear again that your heavenly Father is not disappointed in you. Rather, through Jesus, He considers you to be His beloved child, with whom He is well pleased.

After a look at three Old Testament father-son stories that point the way to the promised Messiah, we now celebrate His nativity, His arrival on earth as a little baby, the long-expected One—the Son of Man and Son of God. Along with the Old Testament people, we rejoice that our Savior is now here. The white liturgical colors of the season can help remind us that Jesus is the perfect Son who takes our place so that we become children of God. The Service of the Sacrament is a participation in the reunion feast that is to come when all who are children of God will dine with our generous and gracious heavenly Father.

The beginning of John's Gospel takes us back to the beginning of the world, which suits the purposes of this sermon series well. At creation, God establishes the Father-child relationship with mankind, only to see us rebel against Him through the fall into sin. Though our relationship is broken, God promises that a seed of the woman would be our Savior. Many would-be saviors have come and gone, and all have disappointed. We find out that this promised Seed was there at the beginning. He is the "only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth," and He has come down from heaven to dwell among us as the true Son of Man in whom there is salvation.

Galatians 4:1–7 further fleshes out our relationship to God now that Jesus has come. God sent forth His Son to take our place that we might receive adoption as sons. Our adoption leads us to rejoice in all of the gifts we receive from the inheritance of our heavenly Father.

Come join us as we investigate from scripture the phrase, "This is My Son." Wednesdays at 6:30 and Christmas Eve at 4:00 and 10:00 and Christmas Day @ 9:00. All the services are focused on the aforementioned people in this newsletter article all culminating in Christ born on Christmas. Join us.

The Iowa District West Junior Youth Gathering took place on October 22-23. Over 350 youth and adults gathered around the theme "Called + Gathered + Enlightened." Each year, the JR Youth Gathering focuses on one of the Six Chief Parts. This year's focus was the Apostles' Creed with an emphasis on the work of the Holy Spirit.

Students and adults alike enjoyed Pastor Ben Johnson as the keynote speaker. Feedback from the attendees said Pastor Ben's message was on point and very relatable, he was engaging, informative, and the kids thought he was a great speaker and so inspiring!


Students had the opportunity to attend sectionals that each had a connection to teachings about the Holy Spirit. They were entitled "Holy Spirit Life," "Building the Body of Christ," and "Holy Spirit Trivia." All of these opportunities gave the youth a chance to interact and dig in deeper about the work of the Holy Spirit.





Saturday night's activities included the opportunity to pack meals. Students packed meals that would feed 144 youth for an entire year! The LWML made this opportunity possible through a grant. Students rotated from packing meals to playing Nine Square in the Air, Gaga Ball, and Inflatables to playing board games and doing Karaoke.

The weekend concluded with a Sunday morning worship service led by Pastor David Viggers and Pastor Ryan Roehrig. Tiffany Smith, a missionary for Lutheran Bible Translators, gave a brief presentation to the group on Saturday and the offering from worship was designated to support her work. The offering totaled \$1,500.

The purpose of the event was to praise God for all He has done through His people. St. Paul Lutheran Church in Fort Dodge was nearly full for the main presentation with people who have been in some way involved in the IOWAY outreaches.

It was great to have Pastor Earl Pierce and Pastor Bob Riggert present. They were instrumental in starting Youth in Missions which became IOWAY after a few years. The majority of the guests went on mission trips and/or disaster response servant events throughout the years.

Many individuals were asked to stand and be recognized, including those who donated clothes, underwear, and socks. Many also made countless quilts, hygiene kits, bandages, mats, hats, witness bracelets, and other items for the homeless.

Several people shared that their lives and careers were changed by their mission involvement through IOWAY.

Following the event, many people told me they enjoyed the day and that the Holy Spirit filled the church!






