DOSE OF WISDOM

Acts 17:10-12

¹⁰ The brothers immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea, and when they arrived they went into the Jewish synagogue. ¹¹ Now these Jews were more noble than those in Thessalonica; they received the word with all eagerness, examining the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so. ¹² Many of them therefore believed, with not a few Greek women of high standing as well as men.

There are many things to write about this month. First, I continue to deliberate the call to Michigan. Continue to pray for us. Once again, I am in the "age" and stage of my ministry that I am desirable to other congregations. We have a gap of retiring pastors and not enough younger pastors filling those gaps so the burden of filling those calls falls on us pastors who are considered in the "sweet spot" of ministry. President Turner said it was about the ages of 37-50 that are getting a majority of calls right now from the field. I am in that range. It is not that we are looking for a call, but my name is getting circulated in the Districts.

We had a wonderful Pastoral Conference in Des Moines (Urbandale). We looked at the book of Isaiah chapters 24-27 with Dr. Paul Raabe who was one of my professors at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis. He spoke to us on the upcoming commentary he is writing and we dug deep into the Scriptures especially Isaiah. It's the reasons I chose these passages from the Book of Acts to show what it looked like for the early church to dig deep into the Word of God. May we have that same spirit here. As I reflect on the calls I have to Michigan and the call I currently serve here in Arcadia, I can't help but think and dream of a fellowship hall full of people eager to study God's Word together here at Arcadia. It has always been a dream of mine to see people active in the study of God's Word on Sunday mornings. If you are able and available please come to Bible Class with us on Sunday mornings. It is great time to dig deep into the Word and see what God did and desired for the original hearers and what God does and desires for us today.

Third, we will once again have our Annual Memorial Service for families who have lost little ones to infant or pregnancy loss in October. This is from the service folder—

"The death of a child is a horrible event that reminds us how broken this fallen world is. The grief and pain of such a loss may fade into the background of our lives, but it never truly disappears. Events in our lives can bring those feelings rushing back as strongly as we felt them at the time.

One purpose of this service is to assure you that God has never forgotten your pain or your grief. He is always with you remembering as you do your loss of that little one. He surrounds you with His love and care and holds you in His arms. For the sake of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection, God even forgives those moments when you cry out in anger or frustration at Him or at others as you struggle with an event none of us can really understand.

We also want you to know that you are not alone in this community. Many have experienced this loss, some publicly and others in privacy and silence. As a community of those who trust Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, God brings us together to support each other in His name and with His words of comfort from the Scriptures

We pray this service will serve to bring a bit of healing through the mercy of our Lord... a bit of comfort through the love of our Savior... and an awareness that others remember, care and grieve for your loss.

At the conclusion of this service, you are welcome to stay for prayer, meditation or just basking in the presence of our Lord." Please let your family and friends know about this service. It is for everyone. You know and I know of people who have lost little ones to pregnancy or infancy loss. We want to bring healing and comfort to all who have gone through this pain.




The Evening Circle will be having their Noisy Offering" on Sunday, October 1st in conjunction with L.W.M.L Sunday.



In the busy times we are currently in, handling the finances of our congregation is requiring more and more work. In an effort to save our financial people time we ask that you consider an old idea, that of the Simply Giving Program. To refresh your memory, Simply Giving is a program where once a week, once a month, or twice a month, your offering is automatically deducted from your checking account and automatically deposited into the churches account. REFLECTIONS ON THE SYNOD CONVENTION

My overall impression of the Convention is that our church body affirmed that which is of utmost importance: We Preach Christ Crucified. That was the theme, and that is what we have done since our Synod's inception in 1847.

The Convention emphasized:

- 1) The centrality of the Gospel (again, the theme drove this home). I would point you to the fine essay presented by Concordia Seminary president and former pastor of Zion-Storm Lake, Rev. Dr. Tom Egger, as representative of the fine presentations on the centrality of "Christ crucified." His presentation begins at the 3 hour and 12 minute mark here: Morning Session Sunday, July 30 YouTube;
- Our firm stance on God's truth, found in His inspired, inerrant Word. Resolution after resolution had us maintaining what God says about marriage, gender, race, life issues, and many more front-page issues today.
- 3) The Specific Ministry Program, a distance-learning route toward ordination, remains largely unchanged. I think this is good news for our District, since the ministry of SMP pastors has been a tremendous blessing to us, especially in our rural communities.
- 4) No doubt you will hear about Concordia University Texas, this overshadowed the overwhelming blessing our Concordia Universities are to our church body.

There you have it – some reflections and a bit of a report on the Convention. It is a blessing to belong to The Lutheran Church—Missouri

Synod! We are not perfect, but we do keep the main thing the main thing: the blessed Good News of forgiveness and salvation through Christ alone!
